

Pastor's Page:

Dear Friends,

February 22nd is Ash Wednesday and begins the season of Lent. The word "Lent" originally meant "Springtime." Lent began as a time of purification and preparation. In the early church, baptisms were only performed on Easter Sunday. An entire year's worth of converts to the faith would be baptized and brought into the church on that day. Lent was the time before Easter in which these converts would fast and pray, preparing themselves to be members of Christ's church.

Over the centuries, the church began to baptize and confirm people on days other than Easter Sunday. Lent was no longer a time of preparation for these events, but it remained a special time of prayer and fasting. After the Reformation, the discipline of fasting became unpopular. So, as a way of preserving Lent as a time of self-sacrifice, these church leaders encouraged people to give up something during Lent that they enjoyed.

The early church celebrated Lent only for a few days before Easter. Over the centuries, the length of the season grew until it was several weeks long. In the seventh century, the church set the period of Lent as the forty days (excluding Sundays) before Easter Sunday, in order to remind people of the duration of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness.

Lent is still the church season in which we prepare for Easter Sunday. It is a special time of prayer and reflection. Most of all, it is a time to ready ourselves for the humble thankfulness and sheer joy of Easter morning – it is a time to ready ourselves to meet our risen Lord once again!

This year, we continue our own tradition of preparing for Easter by gathering together on February 22nd at 7 pm in the sanctuary for Ash Wednesday worship with the imposition of ashes.

On five successive Thursdays, March 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30 we will hold a concert at 6:30 pm and a Lenten Vesper service from 7 - 7:30 pm in the sanctuary with communion.

April 2nd is Palm Sunday, where we will celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem during 10 am worship in the sanctuary with the distribution of palms.

Maundy Thursday, April 6th, we will meet in the Large Hall at 7 pm to experience the Last Supper as Jesus celebrated it with the disciples. Reservations are required.

Good Friday, April 7 at 7 pm we will hold a Tenebrae worship service in the sanctuary.

Easter Sunday we will proclaim the resurrection of Jesus Christ during 10 am worship in the sanctuary with communion.

Join us for any or all of these worship experience, so we can prepare our hearts to receive the gift of grace on Easter.
