### Pastor's Page:

Dear Friends,

The summer is a time when many people work on home improvement projects. If you open up your toolbox, odds are you'll find all kinds of tools and gadgets inside, some old, some new. You may have one of the most time honored tools inside, one that the Egyptians used to build the pyramids. It's a simple device, a length of string, with a lead weight tied to one end. The tool is called a "plumb line" which is from the Latin word plumbum, which means "lead."

Masons hang a plumb line next to a wall they're building and the tug of gravity pulls the weight and the string straight down. By sighting along the string, workers know whether the wall is straight, whether it's perpendicular to the ground or whether it's leaning over. A wall out of plumb cannot be repaired; it can only be torn down and rebuilt.

When construction workers unroll a plumb line, they generally don't touch the line. They let it hang right next to the wall under construction. A simple look reveals the truth. In the same way, the will of God is something that hangs beside this human life of ours, but which seldom directly touches it. Relying on our own judgement, we cannot always be sure that any given action confirms to the will of God. Yet if we took a look at the plumb line, the laws of God in scripture and the example of Jesus' life, we realize that in the grand scheme of things our lives and the Lord's will for us do run parallel.

### 2024 Per Capita

Have you paid your per capita apportionment for 2024? A reminder comes each year with the offering envelopes. You may have missed it if you contribute electronically and don't use envelopes. The per capita amount this year is \$36.85 per congregation member.

What is per capita? Per capita is an annual per member apportionment assessed by the General Assembly (national level), the synod (regional level), and the presbytery (local level) to enable Presbyterians mutually and equitably to share the ecclesiastical and administrative costs of sustaining our witness to Christ through the Presbyterian Church (USA). Said another way, it is a Presbyterian Covenant Community Fund — part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Because every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system should be shared by everyone as well. Some examples of ministries funded at the national level are the General Assembly meeting held every two years, publishing and interpreting the Book of Order, training church leaders, supporting those called into ministry through the ordination process, engaging in issues of justice, and building relationships with ecumenical and interreligious partners to strengthen God's work in the world at large. Examples of services the Presbytery provides are mission collaboration opportunities, leader training, call support to find replacement clergy, and trustee support for legal and property issues. Some members of our congregation volunteer with the Presbytery.

**How to pay:** If you haven't yet paid the per capita, you can do so through the offering collection. Be sure to designate the money as the per capita contribution. Thank you for supporting the church.
