

This spring, we have been going to some nursing homes to give the residents and staff a brief concert. They enjoy having us come and we enjoy being there. The Technology Team Needs YOU!

The Technology Team is the volunteer group that supports the livestream of our Sunday worship services. We've come a long way from using a

laptop to stream on Zoom. We now have a 4camera set-up and a Midas 32R audio mixing console to stream our services to Boxcast, Facebook. and YouTube. Most Sundays, we have about 30 people who watch our services live and may have an equal or greater number who will view a recording of the service later. Each service requires a camera operator and a soundboard operator. The team members are Ed Grizer, Mike Kuitunen, Dave Clark, Craig Covert, Ron Fisher, and Jim Hetzler. We are always looking for more members to join the team. Coverage in the summer months can be more challenging and it would be great to have more people willing to help out. NO EXPERIENCE IS NECESSARY! The cameras and audio mixer are pre-programmed and are configured to be operated to switch with the push of a button, with minimal manual adjustments. Stop up in the organ loft any Sunday for a tour of the equipment. If you think you might be interested in joining the team, contact Jim Hetzler (585-317-1956 / jmshetzler@gmail.com) for a more indepth look at the equipment and some hands-on training.

June Meeting: Tuesday, June 11, 2024: We will be electing Coordinating Team Officers for the following positions: Moderator, Vice Moderator, Treasurer, Secretary/Historian, and Member at Large. Our speaker, Reverend Dr. Rebecca Letterman will be presenting "When God Plays 'Hide and Seek': Dynamics of Intimacy with God."
