Pastor's Page:

Dear Friends,

Summer is quickly approaching. It's a time of year when many people travel. Many receive advice on where to stay, where to eat and what to see.

Many caution us to travel light, which is a difficult task. One hotel in a remote area posted a sign, "If you need anything, just ask, and we'll tell you how to get along without it."

The Bible is a book or advice for travelers. Everyone in the Bible is on a journey. There are some books in the Bible, such as Exodus, that read like a travel journal. There are other books that give simple advice on how to get along on our journey, like the Book of Proverbs.

When Jesus calls his disciples together, gives them authority and sends them out to carry the good news of God's Kingdom, he instructs them to travel light.

A typically dressed Jew in Israel in the time of Jesus had five articles of clothing which consisted of two tunics; one was an inner garment, the other, an outer one used as a cloak by day and a blanket by night. Then there was a girdle, a kind of waistband worn over the two tunics, a head covering, and sandals.

Travelers carried a sixth item, a wallet or travelers' bag which held food and money and was slung over the shoulder. But Jesus told them to leave this and everything else behind.

We often find ourselves so bogged down with stuff, with burdens, with activities, we can barely get out of our own way. Dragging so much baggage with us, we are often so preoccupied with such a variety of things, we find it difficult to focus on Jesus and his call on our lives.

People give different advice to travelers, depending on where we're traveling, where we've been, what we've have been through. But the advice is essentially the same. Travel light. Don't get bogged down having to worry about our baggage. Don't get preoccupied with the wrong things. Don't get concerned about things that are unimportant, because we will miss the joy of the journey.





BETHANY WOMEN

BPWC believes that an environment grounded in Christian beliefs promotes the full growth and expression of the individual. Such an environment renews, strengthens, and empowers the individual to participate in the life and work of the church, the servant community of Jesus Christ in the world.



<u>Women's Meeting/Program May 13, 2025:</u> At our May meeting, we thoroughly enjoyed a presentation by Chet Fery, an amateur bread maker. Chet shared his Bread Time Stories and demonstrated how he makes bread. He showed us how acts of kindness can change lives and create a world community that is caring, supportive, and secure. Chet has given away over 10,000 loaves of bread to family, friends, colleagues, and strangers. His stories touched our hearts and stimulated our souls. Every woman who attended the meeting was given a loaf of bread. It was delicious!

Budget: As of this writing the Bethany Women's Budget stands at YTD income \$4,869 and YTD expenses \$848.22 with \$2200 in known expenses yet to be incurred. All local and worldwide mission checks will be mailed out in July.

Afghans: Beth Thomsen has received one completed afghan and will wait until she receives three or more before delivering them.

Women's Trip to Saints Place: On May 19th eight women from BPWC visited Saints Place in Fairport. Many of you will remember our visit last March from Michele Quinn, Administrator of Saints Place. Saints Place serves immigrants being relocated into Rochester through various organizations such as Church World Services and Catholic Charities. They have been in existence for 25 years and have 120 volunteers. Wow! What an operation. They own a large truck and a van which picks up and delivers furniture. They have three outside containers for dropping off clothing donations and a very large shed built by the Amish to house larger donations and they own space in a warehouse to store the furniture. They are housed inside the old St. John's Catholic school. Every room is 3 times the size of our clothing closet. There are dedicated rooms for administration, sorting, housewares, bedding, men's and boys, women's and girls, higher end donated items which are not needed by the immigrants, and a kitchen which includes a washer and dryer to clean any donated items which might be stained. They hold a sale of higher end items once a year to raise money to support items they need to purchase such as bedding and mattresses. Last year they raised \$150,000 at their sale. Every person is assigned their own volunteer to help them find what they need for their new life in this country. We are blessed to be a sanctuary city with an organization such as this to assist them in the opportunity for a better life.

Women's Meeting/Program June 10, 2025: Our June speaker will be Reverend Dr. Rebecca Letterman. Rebecca will be speaking on "The Hill Between the Mountains." On the Hill of Golgotha, Jesus "reconciled all things to himself" (Colossians 1:20) in the most unexpected way. In doing so, he created a path for us as God's people from the mountain of Sinai to the mountain of Zion (Hebrews 12: 18-24). What does Golgotha - "the hill between the mountains" - have to teach us about participating with God's work in the world - in our families, our church, our community, and our country? And what vision of life with God does Mount Zion offer to us to help us live in faithfulness and hope? Come join us to learn three keys to vitality in our walk together with God. Note: At this meeting we will be electing officers and enjoying lunch. Please bring a dish to pass.

<u>Coordinating Team Meeting:</u> On Wednesday, July 23rd, Bethany Women's officers will meet to develop next year's budget and finalize the Program Schedule. They will present the Proposed Budget to women at the September 9th meeting.
