SUNDAY WORSHIP, FUNERALS AND WEDDINGS

- Streaming the worship service live on Facebook, Zoom and Boxcast will be continued.
- Congregants make reservations in order to attend the service using the link on the church website or by calling the church office (663-3000) in order not to exceed the sanctuary capacity requirements.
- Masks are required. Those who do not have one will be provided one.

Deadline for the June Newsletter is on May 7, 2021

- People will enter the Clark Entrance and exit out the wheelchair ramp. The elevator will be cleaned after each use.
- Congregational singing and choir music will be omitted until such a time as it is deemed safe. Soloists will be used.
- Bibles, Hymnbooks, envelopes, cards and pencils have been removed from the pew backs. There will not be a paper worship bulletin distributed. Prayers and scripture will be projected using electronic means at the front of the sanctuary and will continue to be emailed to the congregation for Zoom/Facebook/Boxcast use. Congregants are encouraged to bring their own Bibles if they prefer a paper copy and their own pew cushions.
- Seating for attendees who do not live in the same household will be spaced to least six feet apart by blocking off alternate pews.
- A stationary collection box will be used as a means of collecting regular financial contributions instead of shared collection trays.
- Communion will be observed by people bringing their own bread and juice.
- Microphones will not be passed during joys and concerns. People may share their request using their cell phone to post on Facebook or by standing in place and speaking loudly.
- Dismissal from church will be done pew by pew to ensure social distancing.
- There will not be a fellowship/coffee hour after worship. People will be encouraged to leave rather than to mingle.
- An additional Contemporary Worship service will be offered once a month at 8:30 am before the 10:00 am worship service.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE

- Doors will be left open so they do not have to be touched.
- Frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected between the contemporary and the traditional worship service.
- Use of items that are not easily cleaned, sanitized, or disinfected will be avoided.
- Safe and correct application of disinfectants will be used and kept away from children.
- Air Conditioner filters have been replaced and sanctuary windows will be opened to increase circulation of outdoor air. Ceiling fans will remain off.
- The drinking fountain will be unavailable for use.
- Signs will be posted indicating the way in and out of the sanctuary.
- Signs will be posted about washing hands in bathrooms with appropriate guidelines for doing so.
- Two automatic hand sanitizer stations will be available for use—one on the way into the sanctuary and one on the way out.

OFFICE WORK PLACE

- Church Business and Regular office functions will resume on May 3, 2021 while maintaining social distancing and wearing masks. Cleaning and sanitizing the office will be done daily.
- Office functions will be as limited as possible to ensure essential operations. Those in the office should be wearing masks; if there is more than one person in the office, make sure that surfaces, including the phone, are regularly sanitized.

- A good stock of tissue, touchless hand sanitizers, and disposable paper towels for drying hands will be maintained in the rest rooms.
- High risk individuals and those with underlying conditions, whether staff, volunteers, or program participants, should continue to shelter in place. Please do not come to church if you don't feel well.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND GROUP MEETINGS

- The church nursery will be closed and there will not be Roots and Wings or Sunday School until the fall.
- Beginning May 3, 2021 all groups with a maximum of 25 people can only meet in the Large Hall and a maximum of 10 people in the Small Hall. Groups need to be divided to maintain social distancing standards. Each group must disinfect all surfaces before they leave.


