Pastor's Page:

Dear Friends,

There's a bumper sticker that reads "You are a child of God. Please phone home." How many children of God do we know who have wandered away from their church home? Sociologists tell us our country is full of them, and their numbers are growing all the time.

If it's any comfort, this matter of wandering away from the Christian community is nothing new. It's as old as the Bible, as old as the Letter of James. "My brother and sisters," James writes, "if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, you should know that whoever brings back a person from wandering will save their soul."

Perhaps the most important thing Christians need to do – in order to be truly hospitable to those who may be ready to come back to church – is to listen. Listening, as Henri Nouwen says, is at the heart of hospitality.

Nouwen writes "Listening is much more than allowing another to talk while waiting for a change to respond. Listening is paying full attention to others and welcoming them into our very beings. The beauty of listening is that those who are listened to start feeling accepted, start taking their own words more seriously and discovering their own true selves. Listening is a form of spiritual hospitality by which you invite strangers to become friends, to get to know their inner selves more fully, and even to dare to be silent with you."

So much of what churches do in the name of evangelism is centered around talking. Certain types of evangelism center around a kind of "witnessing" that has a lot of similarities to a sales pitch. A far more potent form of witness is to spend time listening rather than speaking. Only after we've truly listened, have we earned the right to reply.

We all crave someone to truly listen to us; to find such a person is a great gift. The "spiritual hospitality" – to use Nouwen's term – is far more likely than speaking to make an impact on another person. It's one of the best ways to bring the wanderer home.


