

Beginning Sunday, October 20, 2024, an Adult Education Class will be meeting in the church library after worship at 11:15 am. We will be using a series called, "Living Victoriously in Difficult Times." This is a six-week series where we will examine what the Bible says about suffering and why God allows it.



#### **BETHANY WOMEN**

BPWC believes that an environment grounded in Christian beliefs promotes the full growth and expression of the individual. Such an environment renews, strengthens, and empowers the individual to participate in the life and work of the church, the servant community of Jesus Christ in the world.

## Tuesday, September 10, 2024, Meeting/Speaker:

Olivia Kassoum Amadou, Executive Director of Cameron Community Ministries, spoke on CCM's goal of empowering their community and overcoming challenges. Cameron started as an after-school program for children and has expanded to serve the community in many ways. The after-school program is now held at School 54 and at Rochester Academy charter school for K-5. They also have a Grade 7-12 program. The Saturday Academy runs from 10 AM to 2 PM. The morning session provides academic support. After lunch they hold recreational and musical instruction activities.

Their hot lunch program runs Monday through Friday, plus one Saturday per month. They hope to restart the Sunday dinner program, which was stopped during the pandemic, next year. 2,950 meals were provided in August. They serve many seniors and families. They will serve anyone who comes, regardless of whether they are from outside CCM's service area.

Their emergency food pantry provides two weeks of food. Food prices are up, and SNAP benefits went down, so they are experiencing the increased demand for help like all pantries. The Street Outreach program has a wagon that takes food out into the community and is intended to help people experiencing homelessness. They have a medical van that can come to treat a person where they are.

## **Budget:**

At the end of August BPWC budget showed YTD total income at \$4,450 and YTD total expenses at \$2,384. As of September 16, I have received no new income and the only expense I am aware of is the \$50 honorarium I will be requesting a check for. This check will go to our October speaker.

### **Display Case:**

#### **Bethany Women's Meetings:**

All women are welcome to share in fellowship. Please feel free to bring a friend. Women meet on the second Tuesday of the following months: September- June except for December and April which meet on Saturday. We have speakers who share a variety of topics (see chart below). We also coordinate service projects, Women's Tea, and fellowship opportunities.

### **Women's Brunch:**

We will be sharing "Brunch and Fellowship" at *Bill's Long Pond Diner* on the last Saturday of the months of September through June at 10:00 am. We will be gathering at Bill's on Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Women in the Bible Study:**



We completed our "Women in the Bible Study" on August 31<sup>st</sup>. We learned about women in the bible via e-mail every day in July and August. This was a wonderful opportunity to stay connected and focus on sixty-two women in the bible who had a significant role in the bible.
