
## 2021 Business of the Year

LASA, in partnership with the city of Lakewood and Pierce County is at the forefront of the ongoing efforts to combat homelessness in our community. LASA's family focused housing programs, family

> emergency shelters and rental assistance have helped mitigate some of the devastating effects of the Covid pandemic. Our case management services provided support and helped families in need to navigate additional resources. In the unabating struggle with homelessness LASA is continuing to innovate approaches to improve

the quality of life for our most vulnerable community members. Of the many different ways to ameliorate the housing deficit those families are experiencing. We are working on creating 25 units of affordable housing. In that effort LASA just announced a fundraising campaign to bring in \$11 million.
