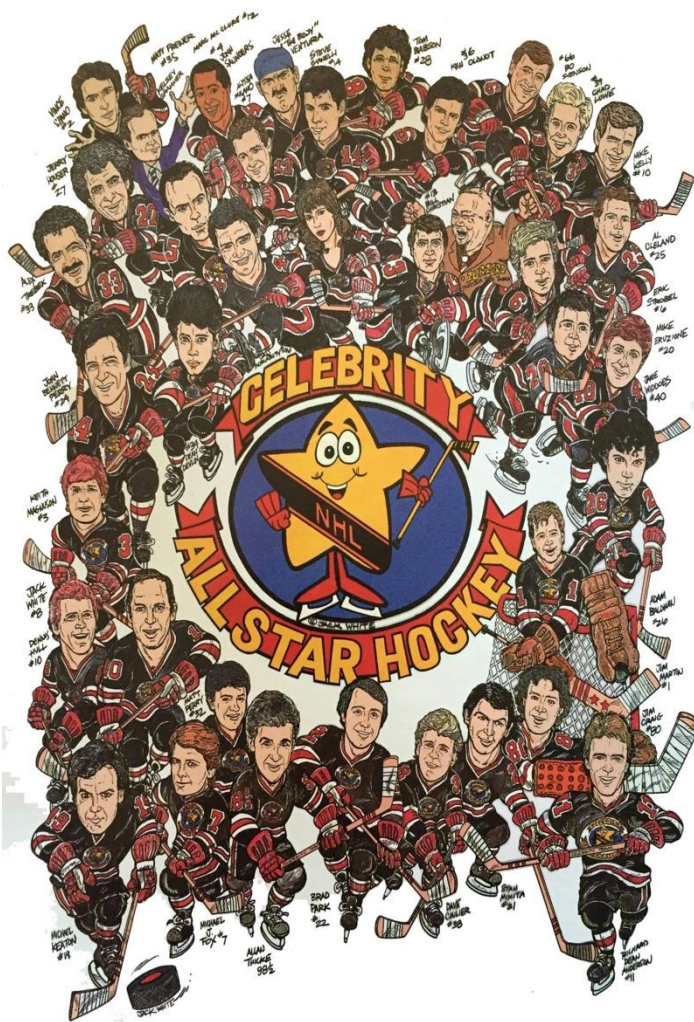

Like a Broadway show opening to rave reviews, the Celebrity All-Star Hockey Team has played to critical acclaim from sponsors, players, press and fans alike, and is expecting a continued long run. Formed with three goals, to raise money for worthy causes, to promote the sport of hockey and to have fun, the Celebrity All-Star Hockey Team raised over \$6 million dollars for charities in the United States and Canada, in just over seven short years.

The 1986-87 season marked the inaugural season for the Celebrity All-Star Hockey Team. Featuring Hollywood actors, hockey legends and former Olympians we competed against NHL Alumni Teams in charity exhibition games played prior to regularly scheduled NHL games.

The first stop in the 3-city tour was the Citizen America/ Northstar Classic played before an SRO crowd of 16,500 in Minnesota who witnessed the All-Stars, led by a Michael J. Fox hat trick, defeat the Northstars Old Timers led by Bill Goldsworthy. The event, which was featured in the nationally televised program "Entertainment Tonight", raised over \$18,000 for the Children's Miracle Network.

The second leg found the team in Pittsburgh facing the Shop 'N Save All-Stars. Once again, a sell out crowd of 15,900 was on hand at the Civic Arena to catch the action, plus SportsVision was taping the game for broadcast at a later date. The All-Stars, led by local boy made good, Michael Keaton (Mr. Mom, Nightshift, Batman), and goals from Stan Mikita, Mike Eruzione and Adam Baldwin improved our record to 2-0 with another 8-6 victory. The Parental Stress Center of Pittsburgh was the beneficiary of a \$20,000 check presented between periods. The Rolerblade Celebrity Classic in Hartford, CT was the final stop, as the team looked to finish their season with a 3-0 record.

The Hartford Whalers Old Timers, led by Mr. Hockey— Gordie Howe, and over 150 years of NHL experience between the team, ended the celebrity-winning streak at two. Another SRO crowd of 16,000 filled the Hartford Civic Coliseum and were treated to some great hockey as NHL Hall of Famers Mikita and Howe faced off against each other with ABC-TV Sports and ESPN on hand to catch all the action.

The success of that first season enabled the team to expand its schedule to 5 games in the 1987-88 seasons. The 1987-88 season saw the Celebrities once again play to packed arenas in Vancouver, Minnesota, Sun Valley, Pittsburgh and a SRO of over 17,000 people in the Philadelphia Spectrum as the Celebrities took on the Flyers Alumni featuring Bobby Clarke, Dave Schultz and Bill Barber. This game marked a major accomplishment for the Celebrity All Star Hockey Team, as it was the first time the team played a game without an NHL contest before or after it. Sponsored by Pepsi Cola, Burger King and Fayva Shoes Stores, the event raised over \$100,000 for Hockey Central and was the subject of a 90-minute TV special. The 1988-89 seasons started with a near-sellout crowd at the Chicago Stadium, where the Celebrity All-Stars tied 5-5 with the Chicago Blackhawk Alumni, in the Old Style On Ice event.

Second stop on the tour was a sell out at the Boston Garden, where the Celebrities skated against the Boston Bruin Legends, led by Bobby Orr, Brad Park and Phil Esposito. The event raised over \$400,000 for Cerebral Palsy, the Kidney Foundation, and the New England Sports Museum—and became the largest amount of money raised in a charity event in the history of Boston. Highlights of the game appeared nationwide on Entertainment Tonight and USA Today—the TV Show. Games in Winnipeg, Sun Valley, Minnesota and Toronto, where we faced off against the Team Canada Alumni, pushed the teams off ice record nearly one million dollars in just short three years of play.

In 1989-90 the team returned to Chicago and debuted in Buffalo against the Sabres Alumni led by Danny Gare and Jim Schoenfeld, as well as Detroit facing off against Gordie Howe, Ted Lindsay and the Red Wings. The team made its college debut in South Bend, IN against the Lefty Smith coached Notre Dame Alumni, nearly selling out the Joyce Athletic and Convocation Center. Northwest Airlines was the lead sponsor in both South Bend and Detroit.

1990-91 saw the team venture to the great white north and draw nearly twenty thousand fans in one weekend as we played the Edmonton Oilers and Calgary Flames Alumni teams. Winning charities included The Rainbow Society and The Muscular Dystrophy Association. The trip marked the debut of Wonder Years star Jason Hervey, and the return of Matt Frewer (star of Doctor, Doctor and the hit film "Honey, I Shrunk the Kids.")

Dozens of pieces of game-used memorabilia are available with stories that enhance to documentary.

Next up was our return to Pittsburgh and a challenge from the Penguins Alumni. Led By a charged-up Dave Coulier (three goals and three assists), Jason Priestley (three goals) and Mike Eruzione (six points) the All Stars were victorious and provided necessary funding for the Parental Stress Center, with big assists from Foodland and Rosenbluth Travel.

Games in Detroit, Boston and Indianapolis, all sponsored in part by Northwest Airlines gave the team stiff competition. In Boston, The Raytheon Gold Medal Challenge, saw the 1980 USA Olympic Hockey team as its competition. The game ended tied, but the real winner was the USO. In Indianapolis a near sell out crowd saw the Celebrity All Stars meet the Indianapolis Hockey Heroes. All proceeds went to "Survive Alive," the official children's charity of the Indianapolis Fire Fighters. The 1991-92 season saw the team take a slightly different course of play.

Having competed against most of the established NHL alumni teams, and charity causes lining up for games, the team answered the call. Sold out arenas in college hockey towns with contests against Cornell and Wisconsin led off the year. Charities included the hockey alumni scholarship funds and the local youth hockey associations of both prestigious institutes of higher learning. 1992 Starting off with a bang as the Hollywood squad faced off against the gold medal winning 1980 USA Olympic Hockey team in Dallas. Richard Dean Anderson was traded to Team USA for that game and many of our regulars found themselves skating against their own teammates. Jim Craig, Mike Eruzione and Eric Strobel skated for the red, white and blue. While the black clad Celebrity All Star Hockey Team had our ranks bolstered with Chip and Pepper of NBC's Cartoon Saturday.

The last two games of the 1991-92 season saw us travel to Saskatoon, Saskatchewan and Fort Wayne Indiana. In Saskatoon the team played against a squad led by NHL Great Gordie Howe and raised money to help save a financially ailing farming town of Radisson and their community center ice rink. In Fort Wayne it was another sold out crowd watching the stars take on the Fort Wayne Comets Alumni and raising funds for the Hoosier Alliance Against Drugs.

For 1992-93 the season included games in Milwaukee and Edmonton, Rochester, St. Louis, Salt Lake City and London,

1996-97 saw a season as good as ever with games in Los Angeles, Minneapolis, Tucson, Detroit and San Jose. 1999-2000 promises more action as games are presently being scheduled.

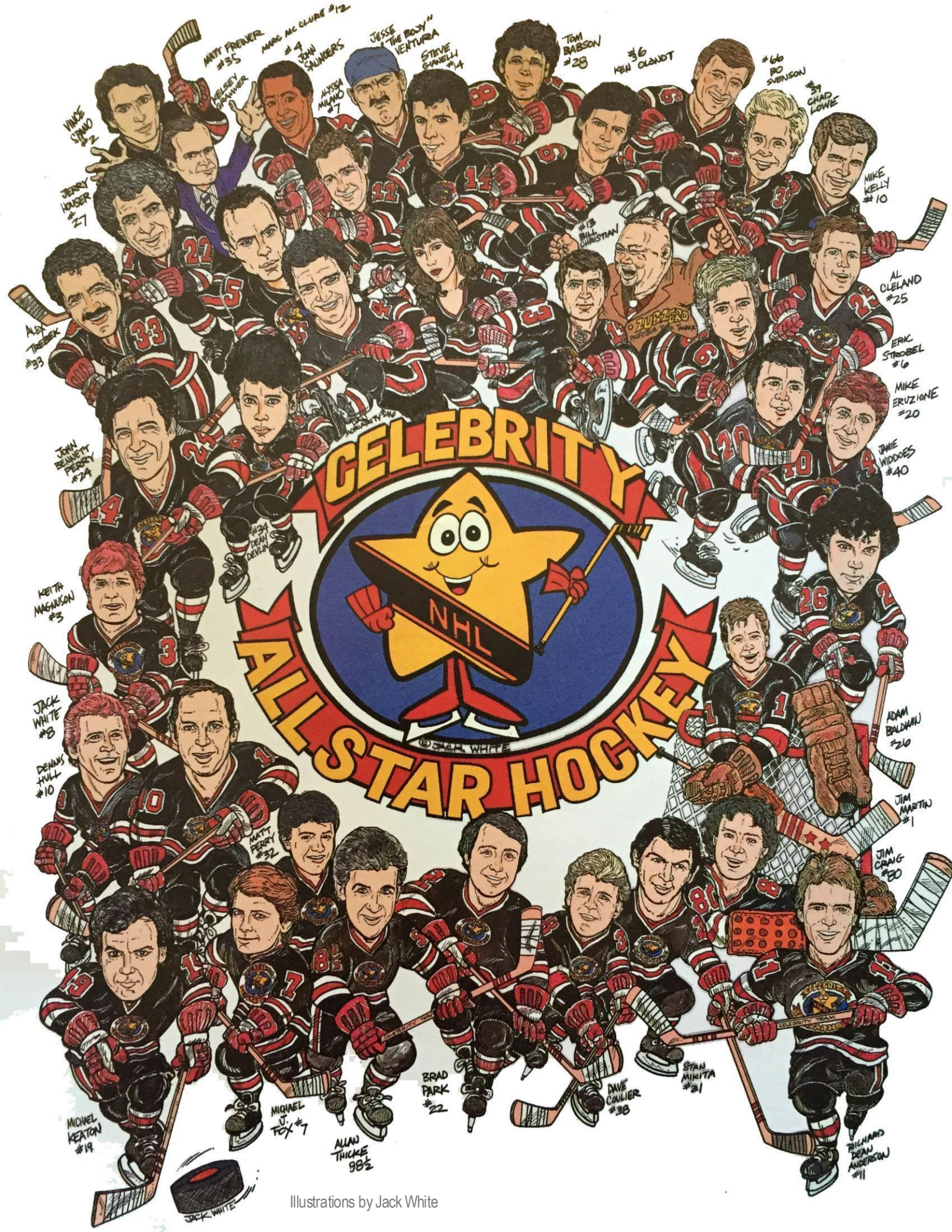
