Greetings everyone!

3 Visions Farm is coming along with the influx of new plant growth and further expansion on the plot. Adding to the plant bed that we set up about two weeks ago, we've set in additional space for the beans we sprouted in the beginning of July. As you can see, they're still standing strong and robust with only a few losses thus far during their adjustment. Unfortunately, we did lose a few of the other plants we added from sprouts in the previous bed but they'll be replaced with new growth. The beets in particular seem to be fairing very well and a handful of henpeck are still happily sunning their leaves!









With our summer crops bursting with tomatoes, red onions and the first of many beautiful blue lakes, we've been setting up the fall crops bit by bit. Another section is added to the side for the next set of collards, mustard greens and other leafy veggies while adjustments are being made to the walkway around it. To make it bigger and easier to access, another path is being dug and leveled

with dirt and wood since we're on a slope. A slight trench is included to collect water runoff as well. We're certainly not stopping here until every bit of the space is utilized to capacity but it will be done a section at a time.
