Let's Go Crabbing


Newport Oregon is called the "Dungeness Crab Capital of the World". Crabbing is a year-round activity, but the crabs are fattest in months that end in "er" (i.e. September, October, November, & December).

- ◆ **CATCH IT:** Crabbing can almost always yield a successful trip and requires minimal gear which can often be rented from various locations.
- ◆ **BUY IT:** Purchase it live and prepare it yourself, or take it home. If you're taking live crab home, be sure to follow the recommendations for keeping them cold.
- ◆ **EAT IT:** Why bother catching and cleaning crab, just eat it! There are several restaurants along the Bay Front and within Newport to enjoy delicious crab!
- ◆ Whether you catch or buy crab to eat during your stay at the Landing at Newport, cooking crab within a condo is prohibited due to the smell and mess. However, for your convenience, crab cleaning stations are located along the marina, and crab cookers, as well as grills, are available on the Landing's common patio.

Newport's' Sea Lions

The male California sea lions call Yaquina Bay their home for eleven months of the year. Early July, the sea lions migrate to the Channel Islands in California to mate with the female sea lions who stay there year-round, then return early August. They bask, bark, and roll about on their very own docks just behind Clearwater restaurant and Port Dock One, where they can be seen up-close and are an entertaining attraction.

Monoprint Basics with Botanicals




Instructor LaRaye Rushing will teach you how to create detailed, one-off prints from dried, pressed plants and flowers you've brought from home, the farmers market, or from class materials provided; *(all plants need to be dried and pressed ahead of class time which can be achieved by laying the plants between sheets of paper and putting books/heavy objects on top; drying time varies)*. The class will cover the basics, explore how to prepare plant materials for use as a stencil, and creating the final print with the press.

Deadline to register is Oct. 10th. Adults and 14+ with an adult. Cost is \$65.00 + \$10.00 material fee. All skill levels welcome! **Class is Tuesday, October 14th, 5:00—7:00 pm.**

Gyotaku Printmaking


Learn about the Japanese style of printmaking called Gyotaku and make cards using a real octopus specimen. This is a fun beginner class suitable for new and experienced students alike. You will learn step-by-step how to apply ink to the octopus specimen, then transfer an image of it to your cards. This is a great class for those who have an interest in art but thought they couldn't draw—no drawing or painting required!

Registration closes Oct. 16th. Adults and 12+ with an adult. Cost is \$100 and includes all materials. Students should wear clothes that they may get ink on. If you can bring scrap papers to class as inking sheets, that would be helpful. **Class is Saturday, October 18th, 1:00—4:00 pm.**



Surf & Rocks in Watercolor

In this **TWO-DAY** workshop you will study crashing waves on jagged rocks using a variety of watercolor techniques, and gain skills with washes and brush effects for luminous waves and textured rocks in your coastal landscapes. The second day of class will cover how to finish your completed painting by gluing it to a panel and sealing it with cold wax so it is ready to be displayed. Some experience with basic watercolor painting, especially on cotton rag paper, will be helpful for this class.



Registration deadline is Oct. 20th. Cost is \$125 and although all materials will be provided, the instructor will provide a list of suggested supplies for those that would like it.
