

# Assignment Ideas for *I Ran So You Could Fly* (The Paris O'Ree Story)

This resource provides a range of flexible assignment ideas designed for Canadian secondary classrooms. Assignments support English Language Arts, Social Studies, and Black History studies, and may be adapted for individual, small-group, or whole-class instruction.

- **Literary Analysis Essay:** Analyze how the novel explores freedom, resistance, or moral courage using textual evidence.
- **Character Reflection Journal:** Write a series of journal entries from the perspective of a key character at pivotal moments.
- **Historical Inquiry Project:** Research a real historical event or figure connected to the themes of the novel and present findings.
- **Creative Monologue:** Create a dramatic monologue that gives voice to a character whose perspective is often unheard.
- **Comparative Reflection:** Compare the novel's events with contemporary issues of equity, justice, or human rights.
- **Visual Storytelling Project:** Create artwork, a graphic scene, or a digital storyboard representing a key moment from the novel.
- **Found Poetry Assignment:** Use lines or themes from the text to construct an original poem.
- **Media Connection Task:** Analyze how modern media portrays similar themes of freedom or injustice.
- **Debate or Seminar:** Participate in a guided discussion or debate on ethical choices faced by characters.
- **Personal Response Essay:** Reflect on how the story changed or challenged your understanding of history.
