# **GENERAL RULES**

#### • No smoking on the premises

- No Dogs
- Stallion handlers must be 18 years of age
- Horses not under handler control will be excused from the ring by the ring steward
- Please do not climb on arena fencing during the show
- Unless otherwise specified on the showbill, all classes will follow WI State Horse Council show guidelines: http://wisconsinhorsecouncil.org/index.php?page=detail&post\_id=1344
- Decisions made by the judges are final. Comments/complaints need to be submitted in writing for management review.
- Suggestions for future judges will be accepted for 2022 at the annual planning meeting.

# **DEFINITIONS**

- NOVICE—Rider has not won a first place in a canter class *in that division* before January 1 of the current year. No trainers or riding instructors.
- MAIDEN—Horse has not won a first place in a canter class *in that division* before January 1 of the current year.
- JUNIOR HORSE—Horses that are 5 or younger as of the current year
- SENIOR HORSE—Horse that are 6 or older as of the current year
- AGED HORSE—Horses that are 12 or older as of the current year
- RIDER AGE—Age as of January 1 of the current year
- O/F—Over Fences

Pre-enter at least one week prior to each show to avoid additional office fees!

# **CLASS ENTRIES**

• ENTRIES—Just fill out the current year entry form and send it to us with your current negative coggins (within 12 moths prior to show). You can register for all shows at once! No need to fill out all the information multiple times!

#### PLEASE !

Pre-register as soon as possible, even if you aren't sure you will show your horse. You may scratch up to 2 classes prior to your entered class at NO CHARGE! If you decide not to come to a show, just let us know and we'll drop all your classes for you.

#### NOW ACCEPTING ONLINE REGISTRATION!

- EXHIBITOR NUMBERS—When you enter (either prior to the show or the morning of the show), we will assign each horse/exhibitor combination a different number. That number will be used for all of our shows. We use this number to track your points for year-end awards. Requests for specific numbers will be honored if possible in order of the entries received.
- PAYMENT FOR ENTRIES—Payment is accepted in the form of cash or personal check. An NSF charge of \$30 will be assessed to any returned checks and all points will be suspended until payment is made in full. Payment must be made the day of the show prior to your leaving the show grounds.
- ADDS/DROPS—If you need to add or drop a class, you must notify the show office a minimum of two classes before the one you'd like to add/drop. Example: If you want to add or drop Class #7, you must inform the office before the start of class #5. Refunds will not be given for late notification or exhibitors missing a class.
- CONCERNS/COMPLAINTS—Any concerns or complaints should be sent in writing to: Show Complaints, Creekview Riding Center, 3900 Creekview Road, De Pere, WI 54115. All written concerns/complaints will be anonymously discussed at our year end meeting.

# **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

- Halter Classes—Judged strictly on the horse's conformation.
- Showmanship Classes—Judged on the handler's presentation of a horse at halter. Pattern may be requested by the judge. Exhibitors may be asked to execute a walk, trot, back, stand for inspection, pivot, or pull-turn.
- Lunge Line Classes—Judged on a horse's conformation as well as movement and performance on a lunge line. Exhibitors are timed (45 seconds each direction) and must present the walk, jog or trot, and lope or canter in each direction as well as stand horse for conformation inspection.
- Hunter In Hand Class—Judged on a horse's movement in hand as well as conformation. Hunter movement is desirable. Exhibitors will be asked to execute a triangle pattern consisting of a walk and trot as well as stand for inspection of conformation.
- Leadline Class—Judged on rider's form and skill under English or Western tack.
- Pleasure Classes—Judged on a horse's movement and performance on the flat under English or Western tack.
- Equitation & Horsemanship Classes—Judged on a rider's form and skill under English or Western tack. Pattern may be requested by the judge.
- Disciplined Rail Class—Judged on execution of skills under English or Western tack announced by the judge during the class.
- Trail Classes—Judged on horse's execution of a series of obstacles.

# <u>RULES</u>

- Classes will follow the equipment and performance rules as written in the WI Horse Council Guidelines. Jump heights and class descriptions listed on the showbill may vary from WHC definitions. If in doubt, please contact us before the show date for clarification of rules.
- Final rule decisions will be determined by Creekview Riding Center show management

# **CLASS AWARDS**

- The first six places in each class at each show will receive an award
- The first six places in the 10 & Under classes will receive their respective awards, and the remaining exhibitors will receive a participation award, so everyone wins something!
- Awards may be picked up at the awards table after the class ends

# \*Western Riding & Ranch Riding Classes

• Western Riding and Ranch Riding classes will only be held if there are 4 or more exhibitors at the show. Class must be held at least 5 times to count for awards

# YEAR-END AWARDS

- Points are calculated for each horse/exhibitor combination throughout the year
- To qualify for a year-end award, exhibitors must
  - Use the same exhibitor number for each horse/exhibitor combination for all shows
  - Show in a particular class under at least 5 of the 7 judges
  - Earn at least 5 points in that class
  - Exhibit good sportsmanship throughout the year
- The top two exhibitors (highest cumulative point total) at the end of the year will be named the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion for that class
- Awards will be presented at our annual Awards banquet in October
- Points will be awarded as follows

- Ties will be broken in the following order
  - Exhibitor who has won the most 1st place awards
  - Exhibitor who has shown at the most shows
- If top two exhibitors are still tied after the above criteria are determined, two awards will be given, stating each exhibitor as Tied for Grand Champion.
- If the 2nd and 3rd exhibitors are still tied after the above criteria are determined, three awards will be given. A Grand Champion and two Tied for Reserve Champions.

# VERSATILITY AWARDS

- Points are calculated for each horse/exhibitor combination throughout the year. Horses must use the same exhibitor number for all shows.
- The top point earning horse/exhibitor combination in each group will be named our 2022 Versatility Champion
- To qualify, exhibitors must show under at least 5 of the 7 judges
- Versatility points will be awarded using the same point system as the year-end awards
