BACK TO SCHOOL ISSUE!!!

Greetings from Mr. Chris Turpin

Welcome to another new school year. The 2020-21 school year promises to be unique because of COVID-19 pandemic. These past few months have been challenging for everyone, and I hope that you are safe and healthy during this time. As the state of this health emergency changes from state to state, day to day, moment by moment we will remain focused on providing the best education possible given the circumstances. I have been working with the district's administration staff along with our local county health officials to have several contingencies in place depending on the extent of community spread in our communities. I want you to understand that I am hoping that we can start this year as close to normal as possible, yet focusing on safety. Please help our school by keeping any sick kids at home. We love our students and want them all to be back with us but Our plan basically has three phases:

Phase I- No community spread: In this phase we will resume school

as close to normal with additional time and attention spent on hygiene and disinfecting high traffic areas in the school. During this phase, we will also continue to provide educational information to the community to help mitigate and slow the transmission of this disease. You may also see some minor changes in the cafeteria, morning routines, and school events. Practicing social distancing when possible will be encouraged.

Phase II- Minimal to Moderate Spread: In this phase, our school will be doing a combination of face to face learning with remote learning. This is the phase where local or state officials have recommended that we limit the number of occupants at school. In this case we will be splitting the families based on last names to come either Monday and Wednesdays or Tuesdays and Thursdays with alternating Friday. I realize that this is going to cause some inconvenience and I apologize in advance for that. Having some face to face instruction is crucial and will allow teachers and students to work on new content

and homework, while providing time to prepare them for their independent days at home. In this phase you will see increased disinfecting and hygiene along with extra safety precautions such as temperature checks. Students will be assigned seats and we will stagger seating to maintain social distancing as much as feasible. Non essential activities will be significantly reduced or postponed if needed. Visitors will be limited during this time.

The final phase of the plan is to educate students remotely as you did last spring. We will use this phase if we are being instructed to shut down by local or state officials. We are hoping that remote learning will be more effective and the transition smoother with last year's experience. It is our expectation that each staff member touch-base with students at least once a week in both the high school, middle school, and elementary. We also expect staff to post new assignments each day by 10:00 a.m. Each family will be sent home one school chromebook for use. We also have a plan in place

to help provide internet connectivity. Should this be an issue, please contact me at school. At this point, the plan could still be subject to change as this pandemic keeps changing. I just want you to know that the safety of kids, staff, and patrons is important and will be our focus. Hopefully, you participated in the school survey, your thoughts and opinions are valued and will be used to strengthen our preliminary plan. You will be able to find that final plan on the school website and I encourage you to call with any questions or concerns.

I would like to take this opportunity to say I am honored and very excited to be your Superintendent of the school. I will strive to do my best in making decisions based on what is right for students. The North Nodaway R-VI School District is one of the finest school districts in northwest Missouri. Since being here, I have begun to learn the many traditions of excellence that exist due to the wonderful people of our community and the hard work of our students and staff.

SCHOOL CANCELLATIONS

The superintendent and bus drivers decide whether school will be in session.

2020-2021 Missouri School Immunization Requirements

All students must present documentation of up-to-date immunization status, including month, day, and year of each immunization before attending school.

The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) allows a 4-day grace period. Students in all grade levels may receive immunizations up to four days before the due date.

Required immunizations should be administered according to the current Advisory Committee on Immunization

Practices Schedule, including all spacing, (<http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/index.html>).

To remain in school, students “in progress” must have an Immunization In Progress form (Imm.P.14) on file. In progress means that a child has begun the vaccine series and has an appointment for the next dose. This appointment must be kept and an updated record provided to the school. If the appointment is not kept, the child is no longer in progress and is noncompliant. (i.e., Hep B vaccine series was started but the child is not yet eligible to receive the next dose in the series.)

Religious (Imm.P.11A) and Medical (Imm.P.12) exemptions are allowed. The appropriate exemption card must be on file.

Unimmunized children are subject to exclusion from school when outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases occur.

1. Last dose on or after the fourth birthday and the last dose of pediatric pertussis before the seventh birthday. Maximum needed: six doses.

2. 8-12 Grades: Tdap, which contains pertussis vaccine, is required.

3. Grade 8-11: One dose of MCV is required. Dose must be given after 10 years of age. Grade 12: Two doses of MCV are required unless the first dose was administered to a student who was 16 years of age or older, in which case only one dose is required. At least one dose must be given after 16 years of age.

4. Kindergarten-10 Grade: Last dose must be administered on or after the fourth birthday. The interval between the next-to-last and last dose should be at least six months. 11-12

Grades: Last dose on or after the fourth birthday. Any combination of four doses of IPV and OPV constitutes a complete series. Maximum needed: four doses.

5. First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age.

6. There must be at least four weeks between dose one and two; at least 8 weeks between dose two and three; at least 16 weeks between doses one and three and final dose must be given no earlier than 24 weeks of age.

7. First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age. Kindergarten-10 Grade: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a licensed health care provider may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease. 11-12 Grades: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a parent/guardian or MD or DO may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease.

free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office. To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school

year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/TANF case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income at any time during the school year.

Foster children may be eligible regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside.

If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for these benefits.

Households will

be notified of their children's eligibility status for free or reduced price meals. If any children were not listed on the eligibility notice for families receiving SNAP, TANF or FDIPIR, the household should contact the school to have free meal benefits extended to those children.

If any child(ren) was not listed on the eligibility notice, the household should contact the LEA or school to have free meal benefits extended to that child(ren).

Under the provisions of the policy, Tiffany Whipple, Determining Official, will review the applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he/she may make a request either orally or in writing

to Chris Turpin, Hearing
Official.

Hearing procedures are outlined in the policy. A complete copy of the policy is on file in each school and in the central office where any interested party may review it.

Title One Program

Welcome to the 2020-2021 school year. North Nodaway R-VI Elementary School is a Title One School that utilizes the School wide Plan. Below is a summary of the provisions of Title One:

- whether the teacher’s certificate is a waiver or substandard certificate,
- the teacher’s academic major, graduate degrees, if any, and
- The teacher’s certification area.
