Preparing Our Kids to Reach our Mission

I can't believe that school will be starting for another year. The summer has gone by so quickly. As always, we have been working hard to improve the facilities and resources for our students and staff this summer. You will see new textbooks, smart displays, a new ceiling in the elementary gym, and some new asphalt at the high school. I would also encourage you to take the time meet all of our new wonderful staff for this vear. I have seen and witnessed many of them in our building preparing already for the student's arrival. This year is going to be great and exciting for all of us. I want to take a few moments of your time to communicate some important things that have been happening. For the past two years, the school board and administrative team have worked hard to

establish a common mission statement along with goals to improve our school. In order to accomplish this task, we had to develop a set of shared values and commitments shared by the staff and community. As part of the Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP) we have been encouraged to revitalize our school's **Comprehensive School Improvement Plan** (CSIP) into a working document that we as the Mustang Community can support and implement to make our school better. Our administrative team and stakeholders who participated with this document believes it focuses time and resources for raising student achievement, maintaining, hiring, recruiting of quality teachers, providing safe up to date resources and facilities.

The mission statement of North Nodaway is "Preparing Productive Citizens that are College and Career Ready".

Hopefully you will see this plastered throughout the district. In order to live our mission statement everyone needs to be able to articulate it. If we achieve our CSIP goals, we will be providing a rigorous curriculum and ample course offerings to prepare kids for post-secondary education while providing enough opportunities to explore career exploration and trades for those not attending college. As your superintendent, I strongly believe that college isn't for every student. There are many successful people working in the workforce, serving our country, or working with a trade. Therefore, our focus, is on getting kids to be good citizens, positive leaders, critical thinkers, problemsolvers, and adults with exemplar character.

I am extremely proud of our teachers and staff for spending the time this past year developing priority standards for two of the subjects

that they teach each vear. These standards signify the important concepts that students will know by the time they are finished with that course. These standards help teachers narrow their curriculum down and focus on what kids really need to know. We will continue this process during our staff development days until the teachers are finished with all of their courses. Teachers will then focus on aligning assessments with these prior standards to determine if kids know what has been identified as important. In the process, our staff have also identified new math and communication arts materials to utilize in their classrooms. The district will start the year with new math textbooks in grades K-8 this year and the high school will also have new textbooks in **Communication Arts** for grade 6-12. Textbooks are expensive. The total invoice on these two subjects was \$78,000.00.

New SLP Services at North Nodaway

We have implemented a slight change in one area of our Special Education Department for the 2022-23 school year.

Over the past few years, our students who receive Speech or Language Therapy at North Nodaway have used a Speech Implementer to provide direct services to the students with a Speech-Language Pathologist providing occasional supervision. This year, we will be using a licensed SLP, Robyn Mattson Compass Therpay, to provide Speech and Language services to these students instead of an Implementer. This model will allow the SLP who is trained in the techniques and modalities used to treat a variety of articulation and language delays to work directly with our students who are a part of this program. Our new SLP will be able to collaborate with the teachers on ways to promote improved speech in the classrooms and will also be available for evaluations, progress

monitoring, intervention services, and annual IEP meetings.

Overall, our District is excited about this change, and we hope it leads to our student's success both in the classroom and at home.

New Textbooks



This includes hard copies and technology access for students and teachers for the next 5-6 years depending on the subject. North Nodaway County R-VI **School District, Missouri** Approves Sale of \$2,650,000 **General Obligation Bonds**

The Board of Education of the North Nodaway County R-VI School District, Missouri at a regular meeting on July 1, 2022 approved the sale of \$2,650,000 General Obligation Bond Issue to its Municipal Bond Underwriter, L.J. Hart & Company of St. Louis, Missouri. "We appreciate the strong vote of confidence we received from local patrons at the election and want to lock in interest rates and reoffered yields that are favorable," stated Chris Turpin, Superintendent. These new money General **Obligation Bonds were** approved by about 65.95% of the voters at the April 5, 2022 election for the purpose of providing funds for a Pre-School Addition to the Elementary School. a new metal bus barn, and to the extent funds are available, an addition to the High School and other interior renovations to district facilities.

The bond marketing process provided the first opportunity to invest to local financial institutions and individuals and according to Dr. Bruce Johnson, Vice-President of L.J. Hart & Company, the BTC Bank purchased \$625,000 and the Nodaway Valley Bank bought \$1,115.000 of the bonds. This local support was helpful to the success of the financing. "It is nice that our marketing procedures facilitated this local involvement while

still receiving fair reoffered yields," commented Chris Turpin, Superintendent of Schools.

The Board of Education selected the negotiated sale of the bonds in order to capture current market conditions, to be certain that local banks received an opportunity to purchase the bonds, and because the proposed interest rates were fair based upon current conditions in the municipal bond market. Mr. Turpin stated that the District did compare proposed interest rates with the national bond indexes and other Missouri issues with a similar rating quality sold at competitive and negotiated sales to be certain that rates for the District's bonds were fair. "Based upon pricing of these other financings, and the national indexes for AA rated General Obligation Bonds our rates were as good as or better than some public sales and other negotiated sales for a similar quality level of bond issue," Mr. Turpin remarked.

The information shared by L.J. Hart & Company indicated that the bonds are scheduled to mature on March 1, 2025 through March 1, 2042 with reoffered vields ranging from 2.75% to 4.00%. The District is selling the bonds at a premium with the investors receiving the reoffered vield to the March 1, 2027 call date. This structure

produces additional funds for the projects with the reoffering premium in the amount of \$42,200. The interest income from the bonds is exempt from federal and state of Missouri income taxes and the bonds were available in

\$5,000 denominations. These bonds carry a "AA+" rating from S&P Global due to the District's participation in the State of Missouri Direct Deposit Program coordinated through the Missouri Health and **Educational Facilities** Authority. The bonds do contain optional redemption (call) provisions on March 1, 2027 at no penalty that will facilitate the reduction of future interest expense in the event of prepayment or a future refunding to lower rates if market conditions make

it economically feasible. The financing proceeds are expected to be available to the District by July 20, 2022 and will be promptly reinvested by the District to earn additional interest for use in the completion of the projects. The legal documents to complete the issuance of the bonds were prepared by Rick McConnell, Esq., of Armstrong Teasdale, LLP in its role as bond counsel for the District.

North Nodaway announced its revised free and reduced price policy for school children unable to pay the full price of meals served in schools under the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program.

Children from families whose current income is at or below those shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office. To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/TANF case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income or other information provided on the application at any time during the school year.

Foster children may be eligible regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside. Households with children who are eligible under the foster, Head Start, homeless, migrant, or runaway programs should contact the school for assistance in receiving meal benefits. Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) participants may be eligible for free or reduced price meals.

Children who are members of households currently certified as receiveing Food Stamps, TANF or FDPIR are eligible for free meals. To complete an application, the household must provide the names of the children, a statement that the household receives the qualifying benefits, the Food Stamps/TANF/ FDPIR case number, and the signature of the adult household member making application. When known by the school that members of a household are receiving assistance from Food Stamps, TANF or FDPIR, households will be notified of their children's eligibility for free school meals. If any children in the household were not listed on the eligibility notice or not listed on the application, the household should contact the school to have benefits extended to all children in the household.

If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for these benefits.

Under the provisions of the policy, Tiffany Whipple, Determining Official will review the applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to Chris Turpin, Hearing Official. Hearing procedures are outlined in the policy. A complete copy of the policy is on file in each school and in the central office where any interested party may review it.
