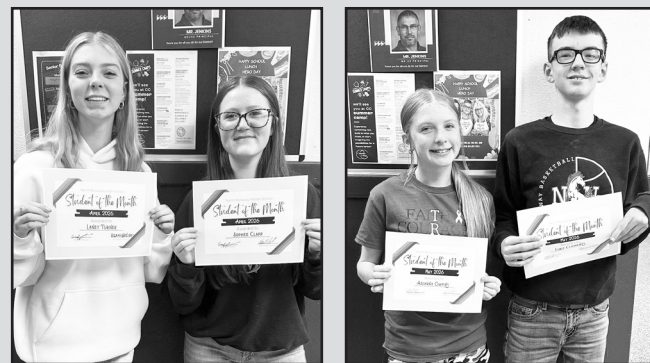
as we prepare for another successful school year.

North Nodaway Completes Productive School Year While Looking Ahead to Future Challenges and Opportunities

As another school year comes to a close, I want to thank the students, staff, parents, Board of Education members, and patrons of North Nodaway for the support shown throughout the 2025-2026 school year. It has been a productive year filled with academic growth, student achievement, and continued efforts to improve opportunities for our students.

At North Nodaway, our focus remains centered on our mission statement: "Preparing Productive Citizens That Are College and Career Ready." That mission continues to guide our decisions in academics, career exploration, extracurricular activities, and student support programs as we work to prepare students for success beyond graduation.

While we are proud of the progress made this year, we also understand that education requires continuous improvement. Our district will continue striving to improve student opportunities and strengthen the educational experience for all learners.

One important topic this year involved the Missouri legislative session and the continued discussions surrounding public education funding and rural schools. I

appreciate the many parents, patrons, and staff members who stayed informed and communicated with legislators regarding issues impacting public education.

It is clear that discussions involving school funding, local control, and educational reform will continue in the years ahead. Governor Mike Kehoe has called for Missouri's state school funding formula to be rewritten next year, including review of the "hold harmless" provisions that many rural districts currently rely upon for financial stability.

As these discussions continue, it will remain important for rural communities to stay engaged and informed regarding issues that may impact local schools and taxpayers.

Another topic generating discussion throughout Nodaway County is the possible addition of a data center project within the county. I want to emphasize that I am not writing in support of or opposition to the project. However, because of the amount of public discussion surrounding the topic, I believe it is important to acknowledge some of the information and perspectives currently being discussed within our communities.

Public conversations

regarding the project have included discussion of a potential assessed valuation exceeding \$2 billion. By comparison, Nodaway County's total assessed valuation in 2024 was approximately \$439 million. Revenue projections discussed publicly have ranged from approximately \$20 million annually to more than \$100 million annually during the projected years of 2027 through 2064, although final figures would depend on many future factors and agreements.

County officials and community members have also discussed the possibility that future revenues or community benefit agreements could assist with infrastructure and service improvements throughout Nodaway County. Topics frequently mentioned in public conversations have included improvements to local streets and roads, replacement or modernization of aging sewer and water infrastructure, and expanded support for rural fire districts and emergency services in smaller communities across the county.

Additional discussions have involved utility infrastructure, including water and electrical usage. Some individuals familiar with regional infrastructure have noted that Northwest Missouri

State University currently utilizes significant annual water capacity while continuing to serve as a major regional asset and economic driver for northwest Missouri. Other discussions have referenced utility tariff structures intended to help manage large-scale electrical usage demands and infrastructure capacity.

As with many large-scale projects, opinions and perspectives throughout the community vary. Some individuals have raised concerns involving infrastructure demands, environmental considerations, and long-term impacts, while others have discussed possible opportunities for economic development and expanded infrastructure investment in rural northwest Missouri.

I believe it is important that these conversations continue respectfully and thoughtfully as residents review information and consider the long-term future of our county and rural communities.

As we move into summer, I again want to thank everyone who contributes to making North Nodaway a strong school district and community. The continued partnership between our school and our communities remains one of our greatest strengths.

We are proud of what was accomplished this year, but we also know our work continues as we strive to provide the very best opportunities possible for our students and families.

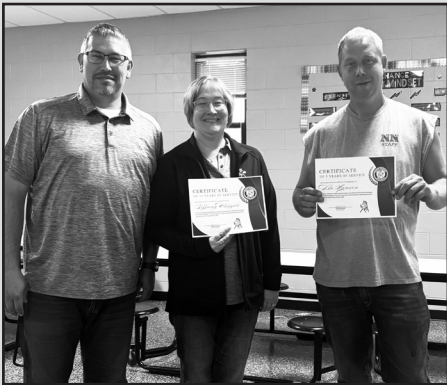

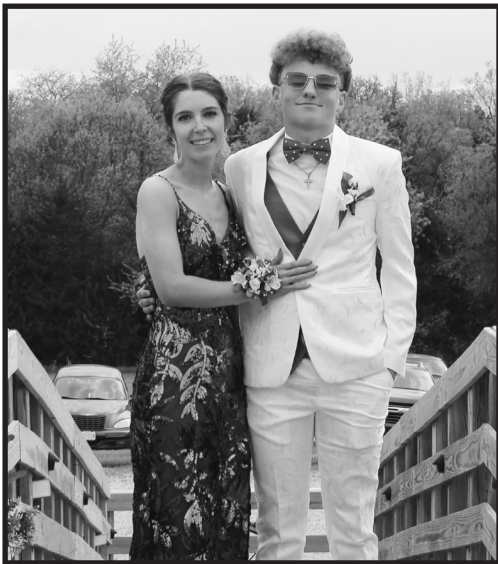

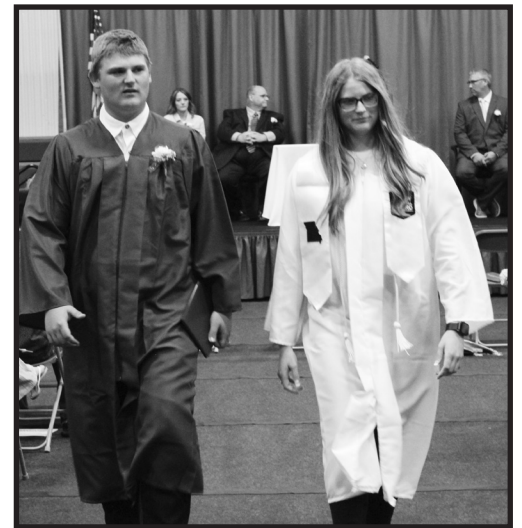
