We Worship with Confession

- P: We come to this moment of confession in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. C: Amen!
- P: Have mercy on us, O God, according to Your loving-kindness; in Your great compassion blot out our offenses.
- C: Wash us from our wickedness and cleanse us from our sins.
- <u>P:</u> You, O God, know our sin. Nothing is hidden from You. Therefore, You are justified when You speak, and You are right when You judge. <u>C:</u> Make us pure, O God. Wash our slate clean. Turn from our sin and remember it no more.
- P: Hide Your face from our sins. Grant us mercy, even though we are unworthy. C: Create in us a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within us. Cast us not away from Your presence and please do not take Your Holy Spirit away from us.
- <u>P:</u> Give us the joy of Your saving help and sustain us with Your bountiful Spirit. <u>C:</u> Have mercy on us, O God, according to Your loving-kindness; in Your great compassion blot out our offenses.

P: Almighty God. C: We have fallen short of Your glory. We have done things that You are not well pleased with, and we have failed to do things that would have helped our neighbor. We confess that sin has come between You and us. We come before You now in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior and ask for Your forgiveness, oh God. Hear our prayer. We want to be in a right relationship with You asking You to remove all those things that we allow to get in the way. We are sorry for what we have done. So, we humbly come before You with our confessions and thanks for Your loving kindness asking for a clean heart. Amen

<u>P:</u> People of God, you have made confession of your sins before the Lord. Therefore, you are promised forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ. So, by the authority of God our Father and Jesus Christ His only Son and by the power of the Holy Spirit, I boldly and confidently announce the forgiveness of all your sins. You have been washed clean and purified of your sins. Rejoice and be glad, for you are a child of God. <u>C:</u> Praise be to God and Amen!

We Hear and Read God's Word

This Reading is from the Book of Genesis, the 18th Chapter. (ESV)

¹And the LORD appeared to him by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the door of his tent in the heat of the day. ²He lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, three men were standing in front of him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them and bowed himself to the earth ³ and said, "O Lord, if I have found favor in your sight, do not pass by your servant. ⁴Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree, ⁵ while I bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on since you have come to your servant." So, they said, "Do as you have said." ⁶ And Abraham

went quickly into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quick! Three seahs of fine flour! Knead it and make cakes."

Reader: ¹The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall, I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

<u>C</u>ongregation: ²When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh, my adversaries, and foes, it is they who stumble and fall.

R: 3 Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident.

C: 4 One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in his temple.

R: 5 For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; he will conceal me under the cover of his tent; he will lift me high upon a rock.

<u>C:</u> ⁶ And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me, and I will offer in his tent sacrifices with shouts of joy; I will sing and make melody to the LORD.

This Reading is from the Book of Colossians, the 1st Chapter (ESV)

²¹ And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, ²² he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, ²³ if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.
²⁴ Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church, ²⁵ of which I became a minister according to the stewardship from God that was given to me for you, to

make the word of God fully known, ²⁶ the mystery hidden for ages and generations but now revealed to his saints. ²⁷ To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. ²⁸ Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ. ²⁹ For this I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me.

*The Holy Gospel According to St. Luke, the 11th Chapter (ESV)

¹Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." ² And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. ³ Give us each day our daily bread, ⁴ and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation." ⁵ And he said to them, Which of you who has a friend will go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves, ⁶ for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; ¹ and he will answer from within, 'Do not bother me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed. I cannot get up and give you anything'? ጾ I tell you,

though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his impudence he will rise and give him whatever he needs. ⁹ And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. ¹¹ What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; ¹² or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³ If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"
