Pastor: In the name of the Faither and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Congregation: Amen.**

- <u>P</u>: (Facing altar which symbolizes God's presence):

Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer, we confess to you that we are by nature sinful and unclean and that we have sinned against you by thought, word, and deed; therefore we flee for refuge to your boundless mercy, seeking and imploring your grace, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ.

<u>ALL:</u> O most merciful God, since you have given your only-begotten Son to die for us, have mercy on us and for his sake grant us forgiveness of all our sins; and by your Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of you and of your will and true obedience to your Word, to the end that by your grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

P: (Facing the congregation, declares God's grace):

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us, and has given his only Son to die for us and for his sake forgives us all our sins. To those who believe on his name he gives power to become the children of God and has promised them his Holy Spirit. He that believes and is baptized shall be saved. Grant this, O LORD, unto us all. **C:** Amen.

We Hear and Read God's Word

The first reading is from Paul's letter to the Romans, 6:1-14 (ESV)

¹ What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ² By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵ For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶ We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷ For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸ Now if we have died with

Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰ For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹ So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

¹² Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions. ¹³ Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. ¹⁴ For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

This reading is from Psalm 31 (ESV) (responsive)

Reader: ¹ In you, O LORD, do I take refuge; let me never be put to shame; in your righteousness deliver me!

Congregation: ² Incline your ear to me; rescue me speedily!

Be a rock of refuge for me, a strong fortress to save me!

- R: ³ For you are my rock and my fortress; and for your name's sake you lead me and guide me;
 - <u>C</u>: ⁴ you take me out of the net they have hidden for me, for you are my refuge.
 - R: 5 Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O LORD, faithful God.
 - C: 6 I hate those who pay regard to worthless idols, but I trust in the LORD.
 - <u>R</u>: ⁷I will rejoice and be glad in your steadfast love, because you have seen my affliction; you have known the distress of my soul,
- C: 8 and you have not delivered me into the hand of the enemy; you have set my feet in a broad place.
- R: 9 Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress; my eye is wasted from grief; my soul and my body also.
 - <u>C</u>: ¹⁰ For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my iniquity, and my bones waste away.
 - <u>R</u>: ¹¹ Because of all my adversaries I have become a reproach, especially to my neighbors, and an object of dread to my acquaintances; those who see me in the street flee from me.
 - C: 12 I have been forgotten like one who is dead; I have become like a broken vessel.
 - <u>R</u>: ¹³ For I hear the whispering of many—terror on every side!—as they scheme together against me, as they plot to take my life.
 - C: 14 But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God."
 - R: 15 My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies and from my persecutors!
 - <u>C</u>: ¹⁶ Make your face shine on your servant; save me in your steadfast love!
 - R: ¹⁷ O LORD, let me not be put to shame, for I call upon you; let the wicked be put to shame; let them go silently to Sheol.
- C: 18 Let the lying lips be mute, which speak insolently against the righteous in pride and contempt.
- R: ¹⁹ Oh, how abundant is your goodness, which you have stored up for those who fear you and worked for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of the children of mankind!
 - <u>C</u>: ²⁰ In the cover of your presence you hide them from the plots of men; you store them in your shelter from the strife of tongues.
 - R: ²¹ Blessed be the LORD, for he has wondrously shown his steadfast love to me when I was in a besieged city.
 - C: 22 I had said in my alarm, I am cut off from your sight."

But you heard the voice of my pleas for mercy when I cried to you for help.

- R: 23 Love the LORD, all you his saints! The LORD preserves the faithful but abundantly repays the one who acts in pride.
 - $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$: ²⁴ Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the LORD!
