We Worship by Confessing our Sins

<u>Pastor:</u> Remembering our baptism into Christ Jesus, we gather as we are to live, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. <u>Congregation: Amen.</u>

- P: Beloved in the LORD, let us draw near with faithful hearts and confess our sins to God our Father, asking Him, in the name of our LORD Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.
- P: Our help is in the name of the LORD. C: Who made heaven and earth.
- P: I said, I will confess my sins unto the LORD. C: May God forgive the offense of my sin.
- P: (Facing altar which symbolizes God's presence): Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer,
- C: We confess to You that we are by nature sinners and that we have sinned against You by thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. Therefore, we flee for refuge to Your infinite mercy, pleading for and seeking Your grace for the sake of our LORD Jesus Christ.

<A moment of silent prayer and reflection>

- P: Most merciful God C: You have given Your only begotten Son to die for us. Have mercy upon us, and for Jesus' sake grant us forgiveness of all our sins; and by Your Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of You and of Your will, and true obedience to Your Word, that by Your grace we may come to eternal life; through Jesus Christ our LORD. Amen.
- <u>P</u>: (Facing the congregation, declares God's grace): Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us, and has given His only Son to die for us, and for Jesus' sake God forgives us all our sins. To those who believe on Jesus' Name, He gives power to become children of God and bestows on them His Holy Spirit. Those who believe and are baptized shall be saved. Grant this, O LORD, unto us all. <u>C</u>: Amen. <u>All:</u> Praise the LORD!

We Hear and Read God's Word

The first reading is from Acts 10:34-43 (ESV)

³⁴ So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵ but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶ As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), ³⁷ you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God

was with him. ³⁹ And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰ but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, ⁴¹ not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴² And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ To him all the

prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Reader: 1 Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!

Congregation: ² Let Israel say, "His steadfast love endures forever."

- C: 15 Glad songs of salvation are in the tents of the righteous: "The right hand of the Lord does valiantly,
 - R: 16 the right hand of the Lord exalts, the right hand of the Lord does valiantly!"
 - <u>C</u>: ¹⁷ I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord.
 - R: 18 The Lord has disciplined me severely, but he has not given me over to death.
- C: 19 Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord.
 - R: ²⁰ This is the gate of the Lord; the righteous shall enter through it.
 - <u>C</u>: ²¹ I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation.
 - R: ²² The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.
 - C: 23 This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.
 - R: ²⁴ This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Come, see the place

See, I have told you." ⁸ So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."
