<u>Jeremiah 29:11</u>- "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

If you are a Lord of the Rings movie fan, you may remember the quote by Gandalf the Grey: "A wizard is never late, he arrives precisely when he means to." Our God is the same way. We may think he is early, and we are not ready, or he is late and we waited far too long. But God's timing is always perfect because he sees thing going on that we cannot see because we are limited.
