Corn Stalk Bales Can Be A Feed Resource

When eating a salad, imagine how it might taste if all there was to eat were the stems of the plant. Not very appealing, right?

Similarly, cattle that are offered corn stalk bales to eat in place of hay also often find that to be less palatable, said Phillip Lancaster, beef cattle nutritionist for the Kansas State University Beef Cattle Institute.

Speaking on a recent Cattle Chat podcast, Lancaster said there is an increase of corn stalks being baled as a feed resource this year because of the shortage of hay and the decrease in pastures available for fall grazing due to a lack of moisture.

“Traditionally, grazing cattle in the late fall on harvested corn fields can be an option to extend the grazing season because cattle can eat the husks and leaves, which have a

decent nutritional value,” Lancaster said. “However, this year, farmers are baling up the corn stalks after they’ve harvested the crop, which leaves only the stalks that are lignified and indigestible.”

He said that when cattle are offered a corn stalk bale, they will consume the resource at a higher proportion of stalks than they would if they were just grazing the field.

“Producers feeding those bales will have quite a bit of wastage unless they grind them and add them to a mixed ration,” Lancaster said.

For producers who need to use this as a feed resource, Lancaster said they need to supplement the cattle with protein.

He added, “For cows going into their third trimester this winter, their maintenance requirements are higher so along with protein they will also need to be supplemented with energy as well.”

Additionally, there is a potential health concern with bales that were made from a failed corn crop when fed to the cattle, Lancaster said.

“If nitrogen fertilizer was put on the crop in the spring and then it failed, the plant may still be holding that nitrogen,” Lancaster said.

In that case, producers will need to test the bales for nitrates, according to Lancaster.



Recipe of the Month

MISSISSIPPI POT ROAST

Ingredients:

- 1 Chuck Roast (3-4 pounds approximately)
- 1 Packet of Ranch Dressing mix (dry seasoning packet)
- 1 Packet of Au Jus Gravy Mix
- 1 Stick of Butter
- 6-8 Peppercini Peppers, plus the juice

Directions:

- Put the roast in the crock pot/slow cooker. Sprinkle both the packet of gravy and ranch dressing mix on top. Add the peppers on top as well (I remove the stems before adding). Then, place the full stick of butter on top and pour in about 1/3-1/2 of the peppercini juice from the jar.
- Cook on low approximately 8 hours (or until tender).
- Shred the roast with a fork and enjoy!

** Note, this is a great fall/winter comfort food and is excellent served over mashed potatoes or white rice.





Promoting Good Gut Health

Anyone who has experienced too much gas in their belly knows how uncomfortable that can be. In cattle, digestion troubles can be problematic to their overall health, said Kansas State University beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster on a recent Beef Cattle Institute Cattle Chat podcast.

“The cow’s stomach is divided into four chambers – the rumen, reticulum, omasum, and abomasum – and the one we usually focus on when speaking about maintaining gut health is the rumen,” Lancaster said.

He said the keys to good gut health for cattle are striving to feed a diet that leads to the proper pH balance in the rumen, thereby keeping acidosis from occurring; and the curation of healthy microbial growth in the rumen, which comes from cattle chewing their cud.

Along with rumen health, Lancaster said it is important for that diet to promote proper digestion throughout the lower gastrointestinal tract.

“Cattle can experience adverse effects if there is a foreign pathogen that interrupts the normal microflora anywhere in the GI tract,” Lancaster said. He gave the example of diarrhea as a symptom that happens when the microflora is out of balance.

One of the goals of feeding cattle a proper diet that promotes good gut health is to keep the lining of the intestinal tract from getting damaged.

“If there is damage to the gut wall, bacteria can move into the bloodstream and cause abscesses to develop in the liver,” Lancaster said.

He added that cattle that consume diets high in starch, which typically happens in the finishing phase, have a limited capacity to absorb that in the small intestine, resulting in hindgut acidosis that could lead to ulcers developing.

Lancaster and his research team at the Beef Cattle Institute are studying places in the GI tract where microbial fermentation is occurring.

“Our goal is to develop some interventions to prevent liver abscesses from occurring,” he said.



Cut the Feed Bill: Manage Hay Waste

Every practice to reduce hay waste has an associated cost, even if that cost is adding labor. The initial investment cost of upgrading infrastructure makes producers leery of spending cash they “don’t have.”

These investments can have a quick return, especially in years with high hay prices. Each small step to improve storage or feeding method has an additive effect that has a very real dollar impact.

Table 1 outlines an approximation for the hay needed to feed a cow or herd of 50 cows for five months. Understanding that 0% loss will never be achievable, every step to reduce losses by even 5% will save \$24 per cow. Looking at a 25% improvement improves the winter hay feed bill by over \$124 per cow.

Keep in mind the greater the spoilage during storage, the poorer the palatability and increased waste while feeding. Regardless of your farm’s infrastructure, consider these factors when storing and feeding hay to the cow herd this winter:

Best management practices for hay storage

- Utilize a netwrap. An advantage of round bales is the ability to store outside and shed moisture during precipitation events. However, a simple step to improve the moisture wicking ability and save approximately 5% of nutrients

on a dry matter basis is to utilize netwrap rather than twine. If already utilizing netwrap, there may still be opportunity to upgrade netwraps as they are not all created equal.

- Consider orientation. Avoid stacking bales uncovered outside. This practice causes upper bales to shed moisture directly into lower bales, increasing moisture content and causing additional spoilage. To minimize loss when stored outside uncovered, line bales in single, north/south oriented rows, flat end tight to flat end with at least 3 feet between edges of each row. If on a slope, place rows of bales running up and down the slope rather than emphasizing a north/south direction to reduce water puddling at the base of the bale.

- Improve drainage. Ground contact can account for over half of the total dry matter loss. Therefore, minimize the amount of water that reaches the base of the bale and how long water sits there. Placing rows or stacking bales on top of a hill with a slight southward slope maximizes use of solar exposure to dry the site.

- Increase bale density. Moisture penetration and bale deterioration are inversely correlated to the tightness of the outer 6 inches of the bale. Therefore, the denser the bale, the lower the nutrient loss. If storing outside, a general thumb rule is a minimum of 10 pounds of hay per cubic foot.

- Cover bales with tarp or store under roof. Storing hay on bare ground and uncovered results

in as much as 25-30% waste. Elevating bales with gravel, tires, or pallets can save you approximately 10% and adding a tarp can save you up to another 10%. Getting bales off the ground and properly covering results in dry matter losses comparable to storing hay inside with an expected 5% dry matter loss.

Best management practices for feedout

- Offer fewer days of feed. While feeding hay daily does result in increased labor, savings are found in feed waste. Research has shown that feeding hay daily on the ground resulted in about 11% waste and linearly increased to almost 50% waste when 1 week’s worth of hay was fed. While feeding in some type of a feeder or hay ring reduces feed waste compared to feeding on the ground, the same trend applies when providing multiple days of hay at once.

- Improve feed delivery. Feeder design impacts waste. Data from Michigan State indicated that a cone and ring shape bale feeders resulted in 3.5 and 6.1% waste respectively while waste increased to 11.4 and 14.6% when utilizing a bale trailer or cradle feeder. Total mixed rations can have the advantage over free-choice hay of less feed loss due to daily feed delivery in a bunk or tire and the ability to add a highly palatable feedstuff to forages the cattle would otherwise sort.

- Manage groups and feed order. One of the simplest ways to improve feed utilization is to know bale quality. Submit samples of hay from different locations and each cutting for a nutrient analysis. Label bales in storage to know where they came from, what cutting, and some indication of quality. Once equipped with this knowledge, feed can be more efficiently utilized by managing groups of cows based on nutritional requirements (first calf heifers, mature cows, etc.). Aim to feed lower quality hay in late gestation when requirements are lower and increase quality leading up to and after calving as her nutritional demands increase. Cows accustomed to high quality, more palatable hay early in the winter feeding period are more likely to refuse poorer quality hay offered later.


