

Note from the Assembly Manager

The Waters Annual Association and Annual Meetings were held in October and November. We appreciate the neighbors who attended. The Board approved the 2025 budget.

All neighbors should have received the 2025 Waters Assembly Coupon Book to pay HOA dues. Neighbors that did not receive the Coupon Book should call the HOA office at (334) 277-5551 or send an email to Info@TheWatersAssembly.com. As a reminder, there are several ways to pay HOA dues in addition to the Coupon Book. Payment can be made directly from your bank (quarterly or monthly) by completing an ACH Agreement. This form can be found on our website (TheWatersAssembly.com) and should be returned to the HOA office. This executed ACH Agreement will allow The Waters Assembly to deduct payments from your bank account directly. Payment is also available by credit/debit card using a PayPal card reader. When choosing this option, members will be charged a 3.75% convenience fee. Payments can also be mailed, or hand delivered to The Information Center. Payments are due on the 1st of each quarter (January, April, July and October) and are late if paid after the 15th. For the HOA to work effectively, it is very important that all assessments are paid for on time.

2025 is going to be a great year and I look forward to seeing all of our wonderful neighbors enjoying the community.

Directions

Beat 1 egg, 3/4 cup milk and a pinch of cayenne.

Place 1/4 cup cornstarch in a shallow dish.

In another dish, mix 1/2 cup each cornstarch and cornmeal with 2 tablespoons chopped dill, 2 teaspoons paprika, and salt and pepper.

Dip about 3 dozen cold pickle slices in the plain cornstarch, then the egg wash, then the cornmeal mixture.

Fry in 2 inches of 375 degrees F canola oil until golden, about 3 minutes.

Drain on paper towels and serve with ranch dressing.



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

Has your dog been to the Bark Park Lately?



How to Clean Your Chimneys

Burning fires in a chimney leads to the accumulation of soot and creosote, a flammable, sticky substance that can cause chimney fires if it's not removed. Here are 4 steps in how to prepare to clean your chimney.

1. Determine whether the chimney needs to be cleaned.

- Chimneys should be cleaned at least once a year and more often if you use your fireplace frequently.
- Take a flashlight and peer inside the chimney flue. Use a pencil or plastic knife to scrape off a bit of the creosote that has accumulated on the side of the chimney. If it's 1/8 inch thick or thicker, it's time for a cleaning.

2. Check the chimney for animals.

- If it has been awhile since the last time you used your chimney, check for critters before you start cleaning. Birds, squirrels, and raccoons like to nest there, especially in the cooler months.

3. Measure your chimney flue.

- To clean your chimney, you'll have to use sized tools. Measure the sides of your chimney from the bottom, through the fireplace.
- Determine the size and shape of the flue. It will be either square or round, 6" or 8."
- Determine the height of the chimney.

4. Buy chimney cleaning supplies.

- Buy the following items in preparation for cleaning the chimney.
 1. A chimney brush, either wire or plastic. Use your chimney's measurements to buy the right size.
 2. Chimney brush extension pipes, to help clean the whole length of the chimney.
 3. A small stiff wire brush.
 4. A plastic tarp or drop cloth for use inside your house.
 5. A ladder.
 6. A broom and dustpan.
 7. A dusk mask and goggles.

5. Dress in appropriate clothing.

- Wear old clothes that you don't mind getting messy with soot. Cover your hair with a bandana. You may want to wear work gloves to protect your hands. Use dusk mask and goggles to prevent soot from getting in your mouth and eyes.

6. Prepare your house for cleaning.

- Drape the drop cloth or tarp around your fireplace, extending it out into your living room several feet. Use sheets or tarps to cover furniture with light fabric.

7. Remove the damper from the chimney flue.

- Locate the damper handle inside your chimney, and use the small wire brush to clean it off. Detach it from the chimney and set it aside on the drop cloth, so it will not obstruct the chimney brush as you proceed with chimney cleaning.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

No Soliciting: The Waters is a No Soliciting community. Do not purchase from a solicitor; this includes the pine straw guys and window washers. We have a No Soliciting sign posted at the entrance. If you are interested in a No Soliciting sticker to post on your window and/or door at your residence, stop by the Information Center to pick up one that is ARB approved. If a solicitor is on your private property, the HOA cannot enforce the soliciting rule. However, if you have a No Soliciting notice posted at your property then you can enforce the rule by contacting the Sheriff's department.

Pickleball Courts: The pickleball courts are officially open! The upper 2 courts have been renovated and are now permanent pickleball only courts. The lower 3 courts are tennis only courts.

Architectural Review Board (ARB): Please remember that exterior changes to your house or yard require approval from the Architectural Review Board (ARB) prior to work commencing. The ARB is in place to ensure that exterior changes enhance our community without infringing on other properties. Blue Heron Bus Stop: The Assembly has received concerns from residents about kids playing football in the street and not moving for golf carts, vehicles or the bus at the Blue Heron bus pick up spot. This is creating a unsafe, dangerous situation for the kids and the drivers. Please share with your children and do not allow them to play in the streets.

Injured Wildlife: Remember to leave only footprints when fishing at The Waters. Please be sure to dispose of all trash, fishing lines, cigarettes, etc. An egret was rescued recently whose leg and severely injured wing was entangled in fishing lines.

Speeding: Please be mindful of the 18mph speed limit throughout the neighborhood. Please remind any new drivers you have in your household.

Lucas Point Playground: Please remind your children not to remove the rocks from the rock swale at the Lucas Point Playground. The rock swale is there to help with drainage and erosion. Children are removing the rocks and putting them inside of the playset which is creating a hazardous play area. The rocks are not to move from their designated areas. Replacement rocks are expensive.

Boats: There have been reports of children/teenagers using the parked boats as a hang out/play area. Any damage incurred will be the responsibility of the resident/parent. The boats are only to be used by qualified drivers on the lake for their intended purpose. Please share this information with all household members.

ST. PATRICK'S DAY FACTS

1. THE SHAMROCK

St. Patrick used the three-leafed shamrock to explain the Trinity. The first is for hope, the second for faith and the third for love.

2. IRISH FLAG

Green stands for Catholics, orange for Protestants and white for wish of harmony.

3. CORNED BEEF & CABBAGE

A staple at St. Patrick's Day celebrations. In 2014, there were 40.3 billion pounds of United States beef and 2.2 billion pounds of cabbage production in the U.S.

4. ST. PATRICK

He was born in Britain (then part of the Roman Empire), not Ireland.

5. PINCHING

The tradition in America is to pinch anyone who isn't wearing green on St. Patrick's Day. Legend has it that wearing green makes you invisible to leprechauns, who pinch anyone they see.

6. WHAT'S WITH THE GREEN ANYWAYS

Blue was the color originally associated with St. Patrick. Green became associated with Ireland because of the Emerald Isles and wearing of the shamrock on men's lapels.

7. PADDY NOT PATTY

The Irish nickname for Patrick is "Paddy" not "Patty." So it's never St. Patty's Day.

8. THE CHASE

St. Patrick never chased any snakes out of Ireland. The legend is St. Patrick chased away pagan beliefs to introduce the country to Christianity.

9. CHICAGO RIVER

Since 1962, Chicago has dyed the Chicago River on St. Patrick's Day. Then-Mayor Richard J. Daley and boyhood friend Stephen M. Bailey started the tradition.

10. PARADES

The world's first St. Patrick's Day parade occurred on March 17, 1762, in New York City, featuring Irish soldiers serving in the English military. This parade became an annual event, with President Truman attending in 1948.

WHEN SHOULD I CALL THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE?

We want to remind all residents how important it is to call the Sheriff's Office for emergencies. The following is a guide for when to call 911 to report emergencies:

- Any fire
- An intruder is in your home
- You witness or are involved in a car accident
- There is a crime in progress
- Someone becomes dangerously ill
- Someone is choking
- Someone is unconscious
- Someone is poisoned
- Someone is drowning
- You see a sparking electrical hazard
- Any threat of immediate danger

For non-emergencies, you can call Montgomery County Sheriff's Office at (334)832-4980. Press 1 when prompted. Some examples of non-emergency circumstances:

- Suspicious vehicle and/or person
- Public intoxication (when not behind the wheel)
- Disruptive and harmful situations that could escalate

The HOA office cannot report incidents to the Sheriff's Office that we do not personally see and have been made aware of second hand. A resident's report to the correct authorities is critical.

Tips for Cleaning Fiber Cement Siding

Keeping fiber cement siding looking clean and new is an easy task. And, if you follow a few simple tips, your home's exterior will look brand new!

Generally, fiber cement siding is most easily cleaned using a power washer. A hose can work, but the pressure is often not enough to get rid of any resistant dirt, mildew, or mold. Also, you should clean your fiber cement siding annually to keep the dirt and mildew from building up.

Before starting, inspect your home.

Look for areas that may need a little extra TLC. Some areas of the fiber cement siding may have accumulated more dirt, mildew, or mold over the year. This is also a good time to fix any areas that need more caulking or areas where nails need to be replaced.

Once you have inspected the area, use the power washer to wash and rinse the fiber cement siding.

During this cleaning, it may also be wise to trim any trees or bushes that are creating more pollen build-up on your siding. Also, the trees and shrubs should be cut away from your home. Follow these simple tips for cleaning your fiber cement siding and you will have a house that sparkles!
