# Golf Cart Rules

- 1. All carts must be registered with The Waters Assembly prior to operation within The Waters community.
- 2. Only golf carts with a valid The Waters Assembly permit shall be allowed to operate within The Waters Community
- 3. Golf carts may only be driven between dawn and dusk unless equipped with headlights, tail lights, and brake lights in operating condition.
- 4. Only electric golf carts are allowed. Gas operated carts are not allowed
- 5. Four wheelers and other such ATVs are not allowed on The Waters streets or green space.
- 6. Golf carts should be maintained in a presentable and first-class manner.
- 7. Golf carts shall be operated with the same caution as exercised in operating a car, and must abide by all traffic regulations applicable to vehicular traffic.
- 8. Golf carts must yield to on-coming vehicular traffic and pedestrians.
- 9. Pedestrians shall always be given the right-of-way at intersections and crossings.
- 10. Golf cart racing, of any form is, NOT allowed within The Waters Community.
- 11. Golf carts are not allowed on sidewalks or pedestrian designated pathways; unless otherwise authorized by The Assembly Management.
- 12. Golf carts are to be parked in areas designated for vehicular or golf cart parking except for those areas on private property that are approved as designated golf-cart parking by The Assembly Management.
- 13. All designated golf cart parking must be located in a screened location behind homes, unless otherwise approved by The Waters ARB.
- 14. Golf carts can be used for bank fishing so long as use does not damage The Waters property.
- 15. All passengers must be properly seated while cart is in motion and may not be transported in a negligent manner or in a manner inconsistent with the cart manufacturer's recommendations. The number of passengers shall not exceed the seating capacity of the cart, including the driver.
- 16. Golf carts may only be driven by people who are 14 or older.
- 17. Persons driving the golf cart are prohibited from use of electronic devices while cart is in operation. Do not text and drive.

The Waters Management has the right to prohibit any party from using The Waters streets for golf carts or electric vehicles for non-compliance with the above rules and regulations.

At the time of registration, the Member must provide a certificate of insurance establishing that the operation of the golf cart is covered by a minimum of \$100,000/\$300,000/\$100,000 liability limits. The Waters Assembly, Inc., New Waters, LLC, and New Waters Realty Company, LLC, shall be named as a certificate holder on any policy. The policy shall state that all certificate holders shall be given at least ten (10) days prior written notice to the non-renewal, lapse, cancellation, or termination of the policy. Additionally, by completing the Registration Form, the Member covenants and agrees to maintain this coverage as long as the golf cart is operated on The Waters property. # TRICK OR TREAT WITH CARE

Before your children start trick-or-treating, review these basic Halloween safety rules:

Get in on the fun. Accompany trick-or-treaters younger than age 12. Pin a piece of paper with your child's name, address and phone number inside your child's pocket in case you get separated. Encourage older kids to trick or treat with a group of friends, parents or older siblings. Make sure someone in the group has a flashlight with fresh batteries.

Set ground rules. If your child will be trick-or-treating without you, plan and discuss a familiar route and set a curfew. Review safety rules, including staying with the group, walking only on the sidewalk, approaching only clearly lit homes, and never going inside a home or car for a treat. Have your child carry a cellphone for the evening so that he or she can contact you.

Inspect treats before indulging. Don't let your child snack while he or she is trickor-treating. Feed your child an early meal before heading out, and inspect the treats before allowing your child to dive in. Discard anything that's not sealed, has torn packaging or looks questionable. If you have young children, weed out gum, peanuts, hard candies and other choking hazards.

If your child has food allergies, check candy labels carefully. Even hard candies may be manufactured in facilities that process nuts, milk, soy, wheat, egg or other allergens.

Ration the loot. If your child collects gobs of goodies, dole out a few pieces at a time and save the rest. You might even ask your child if he or she would like to swap some — or all — of the candy for something else, such as a special toy, book or outing.

# Fire Pit Safety Tips

It is that time of the year again where everyone likes to sit outside around a fire and drink some hot cocoa wrapped up in a blanket. Here are some tips to remember when you are starting up your fire pit and getting all cozy:

#### 1. Preparing your outdoor fire pit

- Make sure the ground or surface is even to reduce the risk of fire escaping beyond your fire pit.
- Rubbish and yard waste are not permitted to be burned.
- To keep your fire from causing damage, build the fire pit at least 20 ft from your home, fences, garages, sheds, woodpiles and wooden fences, and any overhanging branches, stumps, and trees.
- Build your fire pit with dry, rough stones.

#### 2. Using your outdoor fire pit

- Avoid using your fire pit on windy days.
- Never use gasoline or kerosene to start your fire; instead, use dry wood such as small sticks or twigs that do not extend beyond the edge of the pit.
- Monitor fire pit at all times.
- Make sure your guests maintain a proper distance and do not exhibit risky behavior. Keep close tabs on children and pets.

#### 3. Extinguishing your outdoor fire

- Once you extinguish your fire with water, gently stir and spread the ashes to cool. Leave only when they are cool to the touch.
- Keep a fire extinguisher, garden hose or bucket of sand close to douse the fire in case it gets out of hand. If you cannot put it out quickly, call 9-1-1.

Permanent outdoor fireplaces and fire pits must comply with The Waters ARB Guidelines.



- All Players star with one hand touching a wall of the pit.
- The game begins with a referee throwing the ball into the center of the pit
- When the ball enters the pit, the players scream "GA" for the first two bounces, and "GO" on the third bounce, after which the ball is in action
- Once the ball is in play, any player can hit the ball with an open or closed hand
- If a ball touches a player below the knee (even if the player hits himself or herself) he or she is out and leaves the pit. If a player is hit above the knees, the play continues.

• If a ball is caught on a fly, the player who hit the ball is out

- If the ball goes out of the Ga-ga pit the last player to touch the ball is eliminated
- Using the walls of the octagon to aid in jumping is legal as long as the player does not permanently sit on the ledge of the octagon
- Players cannot hold the ball
- If needed, a second ball can be thrown in the pit to expedite the end of the game. The last player standing is the winner of that round.

# **Mportant Notices**

- **Dues are Due:** 4th quarter 2019 HOA dues are due. You may pay by check, Paypal invoice or credit card payment. Please contact The Waters Assembly staff at (334) 272-3200 for additional information regarding these options.
- <u>Resident Cards</u>: It is important to report lost cards to prevent non-residents from accessing the amenities. If you need a replacement card, you can come by the Information Center, with a \$10 check made out to The Waters Assembly, to have a new one made.
- <u>Items left on Sidewalks</u>: Please do not leave bikes, golf carts, toys, etc on the sidewalks as they are a hazard for pedestrians.
- <u>Underage Golf Cart Drivers</u>: Please do not allow anyone under the age of 14 to operate a golf cart. The Waters Assembly Rules and Regulations state that all golf cart drivers must be age 14 or older. This is a safety and liability issue.
- <u>Trashcans</u>: Trashcans must be out of sight when not in use on collection day. It is important that all cans be removed from roadways as soon as possible, after collection.
- **Kayaks and Canoes:** After using the kayaks and canoes please be sure to return them to the beach storage platform rack. If you or your guests are unable to lift the kayaks and canoes on to the rack, please drag them up on to the beach next to the rack so they will not drift off into the lake.
- Leave Only Footprints: Remember to leave only footprints when fishing at The Waters. Please be sure to dispose of all trash, fishing line etc.
- <u>Caution in Construction Areas</u>: Please remind your friends and family members to stay out of all the constructions areas. If you see children playing at a construction site, please contact the The Waters Assembly Staff at (334) 272-3200.
- <u>Lake Safety</u>: As a reminder, swimming in the lakes is not permitted. Also, jumping off a bridge can be very dangerous and is not permitted at The Waters.
- **Postal Delivery:** The Waters Assembly is not responsible for any lost or undelivered mail. Please contact the Pike Road US Postal Office at (334) 215-8785 to report any issues.
- Lost and Found: If you have lost any items or if you come across any lost items in the neighborhood, the lost and found is located at The Information Center.
- Lawn Maintenance: PLEASE do not dump your grass clippings in your neighbor's yard, lots/property or association property.



(5) Sign up for ACH recurring payments. There is a one-time \$25 set up fee. This option is convenient and your payment is always on time (even if you're out of town). #### The Waters 2019 Fishing Guidelines

#### Catch and Release Guidelines:

- Release all Bass that are 16 inches or larger.
- Release all Crappie.
- Limit the number of Bluegill and Shellcrackers to 10 per person per day.

#### Harvest Guidelines:

- Harvest all Bass 15 inches and smaller. Even Bass too small to eat should be taken out of the Lake.
- So please do your part to help remove these Bass.
- Harvest all Catfish when caught. Note: Catfish compete with the Bass for the limited food supply so please harvest. Thank you for helping to remove the Catfish.
