GOLF CART INSURANCE



It is important to keep your golf cart insurance up to date and on file with the HOA office. Neighbors will receive individual correspondence if the insurance has expired or has not been updated. It is important that the permit in place has the correct year. Permit colors change every year and are dated. Current permits should read 2021. Please call (334) 277-5551 with any questions.

Homemade Blue Raspberry Slushy

- 4 cups of cold water
- 1 cup of sugar
- 1 ½ tsp McCormick Raspberry Extra
- 4-6 drops McCormick Neon Blue Food Coloring

In a large bowl, combine water and sugar and stir until sugar is completely dissolved. Add in McCormick Raspberry Extract and stir well. Follow with 4-6 drops of McCormick Food Coloring to achieve your desired color. Stir well. Pour into your ice cream maker (this recipe was tested in a 1 and 1/2 quart ice cream maker) and turn on and run according to ice cream maker package directions. Let run for approximately 20 minutes or until desired consistency is reached. Serve immediately.

Golf Cart Rules

The off-duty sheriff's deputies will be stopping all golf carts that do not have a 2021 golf cart permit properly displayed. If you do not have a 2021 permit, please contact the Waters Assembly (334) 277-5551.

1. Golf carts may only be driven by persons age 14 or older.
2. All carts must be registered prior to operation within The Waters community.
3. Only golf carts with valid permits shall be allowed to operate within The Waters Community.
4. All golf carts must display valid permit on lower left front passenger window as designated by The Waters Assembly.
5. Golf carts may only be driven between dawn and dusk unless equipped with headlights, tail lights, and brake lights in operating condition.
6. Only electric golf carts (as identified by the manufacture) are allowed. Gas operated carts are not allowed.
7. Four wheelers and other such ATVs are not allowed on The Waters streets or green space.
8. Golf carts should be maintained in a presentable and first-class manner.
9. Golf carts shall be operated with the same caution as exercised in operating a car, and must abide by all traffic regulations applicable to vehicular traffic.
10. Golf carts must yield to on-coming vehicular traffic and pedestrians.
11. Pedestrians shall always be given the right-of-way at intersections and crossings.
12. Golf cart racing, of any form, is NOT allowed within The Waters Community.
13. Golf carts are not allowed on sidewalks or pedestrian designated pathways; unless otherwise authorized by The Assembly Management.
14. Golf carts are to be parked in areas designated for vehicular or golf cart parking except for those areas on private property that are approved as designated golf-cart parking by The Assembly Management.
15. All designated golf cart parking must be located in a screened location behind homes, unless otherwise approved by The Waters ARB.
16. Golf carts can be used for bank fishing so long as use does not damage The Waters property.
17. All passengers must be properly seated while cart is in motion and may not be transported in a negligent manner or in a manner inconsistent with the cart manufacturer's recommendations. The number of passengers shall not exceed the seating capacity of the cart, including the driver.
18. Persons driving the golf cart are prohibited from use of electronic devices while cart is in operation.

Grandparents Day

Grandparents Day is a national holiday or observance, celebrated each year on the first Sunday after Labor Day, although it is not classified as a federal holiday.

The roots of Grandparents Day go back to 1956 and a West Virginia mother named Marian McQuade. While helping to organize a community celebration for those over 80, she became aware of the many nursing home residents who were forgotten by their families. She wanted a holiday to bring attention to these forgotten individuals and to honor all grandparents. In 1973, West Virginia became the first state to have such a day. McQuade and others then shifted their efforts to the national level, achieving success in 1978.

The purpose of the holiday, as stated in the preamble to the statute, is "to honor grandparents, to give grandparents an opportunity to show love for their children's children, and to help children become aware of the strength, information, and guidance older people can offer."

Lost and Found

Horseshoes is a Fun Family Game to Play!

Horseshoes involves two opposite playing pits with a stake in each. Players toss horseshoes from one stake pit to the opposite stake in an attempt to get a "ringer" – a horseshoe landing around the stake. Normally two players play against each other, but doubles are also possible. A turn consists of each player throwing their two horseshoes at the same stake by turn, tabulating the score, then pitching to the opposite stake. One player throws both of his horseshoes while the opposing player keeps a polite distance. Fewer points are given if the horseshoe leans on the stake or is close, and points can also be cancelled out for various reasons. The game is played for a certain number of innings (20 for official games) or to a set number of points (15 or 21 for backyard horseshoes).

HORSESHOE RULES

Aside from a few common-sense rules about standing apart for the pitch (to keep everyone safe), and being polite not to talk or make rude exclamations during a service, the rules are all about points. Keeping score can be a little confusing at first, but, to keep it all straight, have these rules handy when you first begin.


- **Rule 1:** Ringers are awarded 3 points. To qualify as a ringer, a straight edge must be able to touch both points of the horseshoe.
- **Rule 2:** If nobody scores a ringer, the closest horseshoe to the stake scores one point. This includes "leaners," or horseshoes touching the stake but not qualified as a ringer. The horseshoe does not have to lean to qualify as a leaner, and the points remain the same no matter how close the leaner is as compared to another leaner.
- **Rule 3:** Give two points to the player who threw both horseshoes closer to the stake than his or her opponent's.
- **Rule 4:** For the "closest to the stake" points, horseshoes must be within 6 inches of the stake to qualify.
- **Rule 5:** Cancellation rules: The twist in the game of horseshoes is the ability to cancel out your opponent's points, allowing for strategy within the game. If one player scores a ringer, the points will be cancelled if the opposing player tops it with another ringer during the same turn. The same rule applies for all other equal plays during the course of one turn. For instance, if both players throw a ringer and a leaner, no points are awarded. If one player throws two ringers, and the other player throws one, the player with two ringers gets three points for that turn.
- **Rule 6:** If a player scores one ringer and has the closest horseshoe with his remaining play, the player gets points for both.



How to Hang an ENO Hammock

Spring is in the air and everyone is ready to get their ENOS out and relax and enjoy the nice weather while it is here! Here are some steps on how to learn to hang an ENO hammock safely wherever you are.

1. Find two trees 10-12 feet apart: Look for two trees that are about 10-12 feet about to hang your hammock when you're outdoors. The trees should be alive and healthy with solid bark and no overhead hazards.
2. Wrap SlapStraps on each tree: Take out your set of two ENO SlapStraps and attach one to each of your mounting trees. The straps should wrap around a wide part of the trunk, about 5 feet from the ground.
3. Take extra precautions to protect trees: Ensure you are using SlapStraps properly and to avoid any negative impact on the trees you use to hang the hammock. Try placing sticks in between the strap and the tree to lessen friction.
4. Attach your hammock to the straps: Attach your ENO hammock between the trees by using the provided carabiners on each end of the hammock. Slip the carabiner into one of the five loops provided.
5. Test and adjust the hammock: Slowly put weight on your hammock once it has been attached to the straps on the trees. Sit and then lay down fully in the hammock to determine if it is at the right height.
6. Leave the area as you found it. Discard trash in designated receptacles, do not leave your trash on the ground. (Added by The Waters Assembly)





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
HOT WEATHER SAFETY TIP

We all love spending the long, sunny days of summer outdoors with our furry companions, but being overeager in hot weather can spell danger. To prevent your pet from overheating, take these simple precautions provided by ASPCA experts:

- Visit the vet for a spring or early-summer checkup. Make sure your pets get tested for heartworm if they aren't on year-round preventative medication.
- Pets can get dehydrated quickly, so give them plenty of fresh, clean water when it's hot or humid outdoors. Make sure your pets have a shady place to get out of the sun, be careful not to over-exercise them, and keep them indoors when it's extremely hot.
- Know the symptoms of overheating in pets, which include excessive panting or difficulty breathing, increased heart and respiratory rate, drooling, mild weakness, stupor or even collapse. Symptoms can also include seizures, bloody diarrhea and vomit along with an elevated body temperature of over 104 degrees.
- Animals with flat faces, like Pugs and Persian cats, are more susceptible to heat stroke since they cannot pant as effectively. These pets, along with the elderly, the overweight, and those with heart or lung diseases, should be kept cool in air-conditioned rooms as much as possible.
- Never leave your animals alone in a parked vehicle. Not only can it lead to fatal heat stroke, it is illegal in several states!
- Do not leave pets unsupervised around a pool—not all dogs are good swimmers. Introduce your pets to water gradually and make sure they wear flotation devices when on boats. Rinse your dog off after swimming to remove chlorine or salt from his fur, and try to keep your dog from drinking pool water, which contains chlorine and other chemicals.
- Open unscreened windows pose a real danger to pets, who often fall out of them. Keep all unscreened windows or doors in your home closed, and make sure adjustable screens are tightly secured.
- Feel free to trim longer hair on your dog, but never shave your dog: The layers of dogs' coats protect them from overheating and sunburn. Brushing cats more often than usual can prevent problems caused by excessive heat. And be sure that any sunscreen or insect repellent product you use on your pets is labeled specifically for use on animals.
- When the temperature is very high, don't let your dog linger on hot asphalt. Being so close to the ground, your pooch's body can heat up quickly, and sensitive paw pads can burn. Keep walks during these times to a minimum.
- Commonly used rodenticides and lawn and garden insecticides can be harmful to cats and dogs if ingested, so keep them out of reach. Keep citronella candles, tiki torch products and insect coils out of pets' reach as well. Call your veterinarian or the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435 if you suspect your animal has ingested a poisonous substance.
- Remember that food and drink commonly found at barbecues can be poisonous to pets. Keep alcoholic beverages away from pets, as they can cause intoxication, depression and comas. Similarly, remember that the snacks enjoyed by your human friends should not be a treat for your pet; any change of diet, even for one meal, may give your dog or cat severe digestive ailments. Avoid raisins, grapes, onions, chocolate and products with the sweetener xylitol. Please visit our People Foods to Avoid Feeding Your Pets page for more information.
- Please leave pets at home when you head out to Fourth of July celebrations, and never use fireworks around pets. Exposure to lit fireworks can potentially result in severe burns or trauma, and even unused fireworks can contain hazardous materials. Many pets are also fearful of loud noises and can become lost, scared or disoriented, so it's best to keep your little guys safe from the noise in a quiet, sheltered and escape-proof area of your home.

- Release all Crappie.
- Limit the number of bluegill and shell crackers to 10 per person per day.

Harvest Guidelines:

- Harvest all Bass 13 inches and smaller. Even Bass too small to eat should be taken out of the Lake. So please do your part to help remove these Bass.
- Harvest all Catfish when caught. Note: Catfish compete with the bass for the limited food supply so please harvest. Thank you for helping to remove the Catfish.

1. In case of an emergency, call 911.
2. Access to the pool area is by use of a Resident Card only.
3. Members may have no more than four (4) guests per household at any one time.
4. Members, their families and guests shall use the pool AT THEIR OWN RISK. Members understand that THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD AT THE POOL.
5. All guests MUST be accompanied by a Member of The Assembly age 14 or older. All Members must have their Resident Card with them when using the pool and must present to Management Team or its designated party, if asked.
6. Pool Hours: Lucas Point pool 7am to 9pm. Blue Heron Pool Club 8am to 9pm. SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK.
7. No diving.
8. No running, pushing, foul language, boisterous behavior, or general rough-housing permitted in or around the pool.
9. No loud music allowed. Electronics may be used as long as they do not cause a disturbance to others.
10. Minors under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a responsible adult. Minors under the age of 7 require the presence of a parent or guardian. Non-swimmers of any age must not enter the deep area.
11. Persons with contagious or infectious health conditions are not permitted in or around the pool.
12. Pets or animals are not allowed, except for the aid of the physically impaired.
13. No glass containers/articles, sharp metal objects or hazardous objects are permitted in/or around the pool.
14. Gum, tobacco and vaping are not allowed in/or around the pool.
15. No smoking or vaping in/or around the pool or pool deck or pavilion. Violators will be asked to leave and may cause may cause the loss of pool privileges.
16. Food and drink are allowed, but cannot be taken within five (5) feet of the pool or lake. No food or drinks in the pool. All litter must be properly disposed of.
17. Shower before entering the pool. All sand must be washed off in the foot-wash station before entering the pool.
18. Street clothes and shoes are not allowed in the water.
19. Swim diapers must be used on all toddlers at the pool.
20. DO NOT move furniture from the pool deck. Return all pool furniture to a neat and orderly arrangement after use.
21. All trash should be placed in trash receptacles.
22. All toys, play equipment, flotation devices, personal items, etc., must be taken with Member. The Waters is not responsible for any lost or missing items.
23. Members must close all umbrellas upon departure to prevent damage to umbrellas.
24. Management reserves the right to adjust or add any rules as needed without notice.

The Waters Management has the right to ask any party to leave for non-compliance with the above rules. Failure to adhere to these rules may cause the loss of pool privileges.
