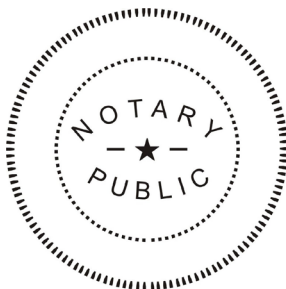

Summer is in full swing, and it is hot! It is a perfect time to enjoy the pools. When using the pools, please remember a few pool rules and etiquettes. No food and drinks in the pool and rinse before entering the pool. The sand is detrimental to the pool system! Do not forget to leave with the items you brought with you and do not leave towels on chairs if the chairs are not in use by you, your family or guests.

## Note from the Assembly Manager

Residents are given a Photo ID Resident Card for use of The Waters' amenities. Each card has a chip inside that can be activated or deactivated based on the resident's status. It is so important that neighbors **NOT** open the pool gates for other neighbors whose cards are not working. It is very rare that the card malfunctions. However, it is very likely that the HOA deactivated the card because of non-payment of HOA dues.

Pool gates must remain closed at **ALL** times and never propped open. Open gates are in violation of the health department requirements and safety risk. Open gates can result in the health department shutting down the pools.

- Release all bass.
- Limit the number of crappies to 5 per person per day.
- Limit the number of bluegill and shell crackers to 10 per person per day.

#### Harvest Guidelines:

- Harvest all catfish when caught. Note: catfish compete with the bass for the limited food supply so please harvest. Thank you for helping to remove the catfish.

# WHEN SHOULD I CALL THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE?

We want to remind all residents how important it is to call the Sheriff's Office for emergencies. The following is a guide for when to call 911 to report emergencies:

- Any fire
- An intruder is in your home
- You witness or are involved in a car accident
- There is a crime in progress
- Someone becomes dangerously ill
- Someone is choking
- Someone is unconscious
- Someone is poisoned
- Someone is drowning
- You see a sparking electrical hazard
- Any threat of immediate danger

For non-emergencies, you can call Montgomery County Sheriff's Office at 334.832.4980. Press 2 when prompted. Some examples of non-emergency circumstances:

- Suspicious vehicle and/or person
- Public intoxication
- Disruptive and harmful situations that could escalate

## Golf Carts

**Golf Carts:** If you have not received your 2025 golf cart permit, please stop by The Assembly office, during business hours, to obtain your new permit. Bring a current copy of your golf cart insurance if we do not have it on file. Golf Cart permits must be displayed on the front, lower left hand corner of the golf cart.

If you sell your golf cart, please remove your golf cart permit from your golf cart.

**Please do not allow anyone under the age of 14 to operate a golf cart. The Waters Assembly Rules and Regulations state that all golf cart drivers must be 14 years old or older.**

All passengers must be properly seated while cart is in motion and may not be transported in a negligent manner or in a manner inconsistent with the cart manufacturer's recommendations. The number of passengers shall not exceed the seating capacity of the cart, including the driver.

## Bike Safety Rules

- Always wear a helmet.
- Protect your head every time you ride.

## Don't Fence Me In

How does your fence look? Fencing is as much a part of your home as your lawn. Each homeowner is responsible for the fence along both sides of their home, as well as in the rear. This includes keeping the fence in good repair, fixing fences damaged by wind and rain, and the general look of the fence (i.e. removing weeds and mildew). Please remember that The Waters Architectural Review Board or ARB requires that any and all exterior additions and / or changes must be approved PRIOR to commencement of the work.

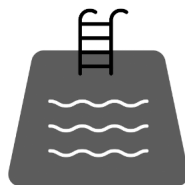
Did you know that where fences come in contact with the soil there is a greater chance of rotting and decay occurring? Homes that are only half a decade old may require replacing due to contact with garden soil. Double the life of your fence by keeping soil a distance away from the wood. In cases where gardens and flower beds are located right up to the fence creativity may be necessary. If your fence is sprouting moss or looking dull and gray from mildew, a good scrubbing with a brush and diluted bleach, or a gentle power washing should do the trick. Paying attention to your fence now by performing routine maintenance should save time and money in the future.

## Summer Maintenance

Some things to include in your indoor summer home maintenance checklist include:

- Changing HVAC filters
- Testing the AC
- Washing the insides of windows
- Adding UV-protective or thermal window treatments to reduce heat transfer
- Reversing the direction of your ceiling fans
- Deep cleaning your garbage disposal, dishwasher, washing machine, dryer and other appliances
- Checking appliance hoses for leaks
- Testing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and changing batteries
- Vacuuming your vents
- Deep cleaning all surfaces

Some exterior maintenance tasks to do at the beginning of summer include:

- Cleaning your gutters
- Inspecting your roof for missing or damaged shingles
- Power-washing siding, sidewalks, decks and other surfaces
- Painting or staining worn surfaces
- Cleaning your exterior air conditioning unit
- Trimming bushes and trees
- Cleaning and setting up outdoor furniture
- Inspecting fences for damage
- Looking for cracks, rotting and other damage on siding
- Caulking around windows and filling in other cracks and gaps
- Cleaning your exterior dryer vent
- Cleaning and prepping your grill
- Inspecting for pests
- Air conditioning maintenance
- Preparing your air conditioner for the cooling season is one of the biggest parts of your summer home maintenance checklist.

(2) Checks will be accepted at the Information Center during office hours Monday - Friday 8:00 am – 5:00 pm or by use of the after hours drop box. **(The Assembly does not accept cash.)** (3) Payment can be made by debit/credit card through a PayPal card reader or invoice. This payment option includes a 3.75% convenience fee. (4) Sign up for ACH recurring payments. This option is convenient, and your payment is always on time (even if you're out of town). ACH forms are available on The Assembly website [www.TheWatersAssembly.com](http://www.TheWatersAssembly.com) and at the Information Center.

The Assembly is enforcing all rights and remedies allowed for the collection of delinquent dues. Finance charges will be assessed on all delinquent accounts. To avoid finance charges, attorney's fees and other collection enforcements, dues should be paid by the 15th of the month in which they are due. Pool decks **MUST** be vacated by 10 PM. No swimming after 9 PM. **Do not prop open the gates for any reason. This is a safety and liability issue.**

## ADDITIONAL REMINDERS:

- Access to the pool areas is by use of Resident Card only.
- Lucas Point pool opens daily at 7 AM and the Blue Heron Pool Club opens daily at 8 AM.
- Both pools close at 9 PM. No swimming after 9 PM.
- Pool decks must be vacated by 10 PM.
- Glass containers are not allowed in or around the pools.
- Food and drinks are not allowed within five (5) feet of the pools.
- Close umbrellas after usage.
- Remove all pool toys, floats, towels, etc. upon departure.
