

## Note from the Assembly Manager

Sharing cards is not permitted and if recognized during a pool inspection the amenity card will be taken up and returned to the management office. As a reminder, the pool gates cannot be propped open and there is no swimming in the lakes. The Pool and Beach Rules are included in this newsletter. Please share the Rules with your family and guests.



## Garbage Collection

Do you have questions about garbage and trash collection? These guidelines for garbage and trash collection can be found at [www.amwaste.net](http://www.amwaste.net) and apply to all homes in the neighborhood. Montgomery County Clean-up day are scheduled for the 4th Saturday of every month for any additional trash you have. The drop off locations are at Pike Road High School and across the street from The Feedlot on Meriwether Road.

### GARBAGE COLLECTION

#### Download Service Information

- Garbage collection is once per week.
- Each home is provided a 95- or 96-gallon rollout cart. All garbage must be contained in the cart. Additional carts can be requested, additional rates apply. Additional carts cannot be used for another residential address other than the home designated, no sharing of carts.
- Carts should be on the curb, or the designated collection area, by 7am on collection day to ensure service. For a variety of reasons, Amwaste route trucks will have varying collection times and may not service each home at the same time every week.

#### Trash Collection

- Brush collection is provided on garbage collection day.
- Each home has a two cubic yard limit per week.
- Trash should be set out beside the garbage cart.
- Small items such as leaves and grass must be bagged.
- Limbs cannot exceed 3 inches in diameter or 4 feet in length, and must be bundled.
- Bags must not exceed 50 pounds

# Report First, Post Second

For many people reporting suspicious or unusual activity on Facebook has become the norm. We've heard reports of residents posting things like, "Someone was swimming in the pool after it closed tonight." and "I saw a car full of kids fly out of the neighborhood this morning and they almost ran me off the road. How can we stop this?" We commend you on letting your neighbors know of suspicious or unusual activity. However, it does nothing to deter or prevent the activity if the proper parties are not informed. In order to help curb and deter those bad doers, always report first to the Sheriff's office (if necessary), then to the Homeowners Association (HOA) and then, if it is something that you need to let neighbors know about you go to Facebook. It would be good to indicate that you already called the Sheriff and/or notified the HOA when you post in a Facebook group. It will help set a precedent to other neighbors when they read your post! Let's all work together to keep our community the wonderful place it is.

## Tips to Being a Good Neighbor

Keeping a few etiquette basics in mind can help to create a more pleasant environment for you and your neighbors.

Part of being a good neighbor is understanding how simple it is to show respect and courtesy to your neighbors to create a truly harmonious environment.

### THE GRIN GETS THE WIN

It is hard not to smile back at someone when they smile at you. The first step to being a good neighbor is to simply smile, wave, nod, or otherwise show friendly and inviting courtesy to your neighbors. You'll find that this might invite others to get to know you easier – possibly creating lifelong friendships!

### KEEP FIDO ON A LEASH

Most people have a soft spot in their heart for dogs. But not everyone! Show courtesy towards your neighbors by keeping your dogs on a leash, and also make sure to address any incessant barking issues appropriately.

### DO YOU HAVE A WATERS RESIDENT CARD TO ACCESS THE AMENITIES?

If you do not have a resident card, please make arrangements to attend orientation at the Information Center on Tuesdays at 4:00 pm and Thursdays at 9:00 am. Please call (334) 277-5551 to reserve your spot. Amenity cards are required for each household member age 14 and older.

Homeowners who have resident cards must continue to pay homeowners' dues in a timely manner to keep the cards active. Only residents with valid cards have access to The Waters amenities. The keycard system provides added security to the amenities while providing a log of when each homeowner enters and exits the amenities. If you lose a resident card, please report the lost card to the Information Center as soon as possible so that the card is deactivated. Replacement cards are available at a cost of \$15.00 per card (check or PayPal payment only).



(2) Checks will be accepted at the Information Center during office hours Monday - Friday 8:00 am – 5:00 pm or by use of the after hours drop box. (The Assembly does not accept cash.) (3) Payment can be made by debit/credit card through a PayPal card reader or invoice. This payment option includes a 3.5% convenience fee. (4) Sign up for ACH recurring payments. This option is convenient and your payment is always on time (even if you're out of town). ACH forms are available on The Assembly website [www.TheWatersAssembly.com](http://www.TheWatersAssembly.com) and at the Information Center.

The Assembly is enforcing all rights and remedies allowed for the collection of delinquent dues. Finance charges will be assessed on all delinquent accounts. To avoid finance charges, attorney's fees and other collection enforcements, dues should be paid by the 15th of the month in which they are due. ## **POOL AND BEACH RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. In case of an emergency, call 911.
2. Access to the pool area is by use of a Resident Card only.
3. Members may have no more than four (4) guests per household at any one time.
4. Members, their families and guests shall use the pool AT THEIR OWN RISK. Members understand that THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD AT THE POOL.
5. All guests MUST be accompanied by a Member of The Assembly age 14 or older. All Members must have their Resident Card with them when using the pool and must present to Management Team or its designated party, if asked.
6. Pool Hours: Lucas Point pool 7:00 am to 9:00 pm. Blue Heron Pool Club 8:00 am to 9:00 pm. Lucas Point and Blue Heron Pool Club pool decks must be vacated by 10 pm. SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK.
7. No diving.
8. No running, pushing, foul language, boisterous behavior, or general rough-housing permitted in or around the pool.
9. No loud music allowed. Electronics may be used as long as they do not cause a disturbance to others.
10. Minors under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a responsible adult. Minors under the age of 7 require the presence of a parent or guardian. Non-swimmers of any age must not enter the deep area.
11. Persons with contagious or infectious health conditions are not permitted in or around the pool.
12. Pets or animals are not allowed, except for the aid of the physically impaired.
13. No glass containers/articles, sharp metal objects or hazardous objects are permitted in/or around the pool.
14. Gum, tobacco and vaping are not allowed in/or around the pool.
15. No smoking or vaping in/or around the pool or pool deck or pavilion. Violators will be asked to leave and may cause the loss of pool privileges.
16. Food and drink are allowed, but cannot be taken within five (5) feet of the pool or lake. No food or drinks in the pool. All litter must be properly disposed of.
17. Shower before entering the pool. All sand must be washed off in the foot-wash station before entering the pool.
18. Street clothes and shoes are not allowed in the water.
19. Swim diapers must be used on all toddlers at the pool.
20. DO NOT move furniture from the pool deck. Return all pool furniture to a neat and orderly arrangement after use.
21. All trash should be placed in trash receptacles.
22. All toys, play equipment, flotation devices, personal items, etc., must be taken with Member. The Waters is not responsible for any lost or missing items.
23. Members must close all umbrellas upon departure to prevent damage to umbrellas.
24. Management reserves the right to adjust or add any rules as needed without notice.

The Waters Management has the right to ask any party to leave for non-compliance with the above rules. Failure to adhere to these rules may cause the loss of pool privileges.
