Note from the Assembly Manager

The Waters Annual Association and Annual Meetings were held in November and December. We appreciate the neighbors who attended. The Board approved the 2023 budget with no change in the association dues.

All residents should have received the 2023 Waters Assembly Coupon Book for paying HOA dues. Neighbors that did not receive the Coupon Book should call the Information Center (334) 277-5551 or send an email to TheAssembly@TheWatersAL.com. Effective January 1, 2023, The Waters Assembly will be discontinuing using the lock box service at the bank to process the HOA dues. If you have your payments set up through your bank to automatically send your payment to PO Box 1844 Dept T-57, Memphis, TN, you will need to change the address to: The Waters Assembly, 2239 Marler Road, Pike Road AL 36064. There are also several options for paying HOA dues, in addition to the coupon book. Payment can now be made direct from the bank (quarterly or monthly) by completing an ACH agreement. This executed ACH agreement will allow the Association to deduct payments directly from your bank account. Payment is also available by credit card/debit card using a PayPal card reader. When choosing to pay with a debit/credit card, members will be charged a convenience fee of 3.75%. Payments can also be mailed, or hand delivered to the Information Center. Payments are due the 1st of each quarter (January, April, July, and October) and are late if paid after the 15th. For the HOA to work effectively, it is very important that all assessments are paid on time.

2023 is going to be a great year and I look forward to seeing all our wonderful neighbors enjoying the community.

PROTECT OUR WILDLIFE:
PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE
DEER.

FEEDING DEER CAN:

- attract predators and increase risk of death by coyotes or domestic dogs.
- spread disease among deer.
- cause aggression, wasting vital energy reserves and leading to injury or death.
- reduce fat reserves as deer use energy traveling to and from the feed site.
- result in over-browsing of local vegetation and ornamental plants.
- deny access to food, because subordinate deer are kept away from feeding stations, and over-browsing by larger deer removes food available to fawns.
- increase deer-vehicle collisions. Vehicle-killed deer near feed sites can outnumber those that would naturally succumb to winter mortality.



Pet Perfect Ways to be a Good Neighbor

The Waters Assembly receives many calls and emails regarding pets. Below is a list of the most common concerns.

Dogs off leash – Montgomery County requires all dogs to be leashed. Leashes must be used in the areas around the lakes, on the roadways and walking trails and in any open spaces. There have been reports of loose dogs frightening children, running out in front of cars and scaring and injuring the wildlife.

Barking dogs - Dogs that bark or howl constantly disrupt the quiet and make it very unpleasant for neighbors. If you have a howling or frequent barker doggie, please make an effort to keep it from disturbing neighbors.

Scoop the Poop - Please be courteous and take a pooper scooper and bag with you when you walk your pets. No one likes to find a surprise left by a pet when they are walking on the grass or sidewalk.

Catting Around – Cats are not required to be leashed but are trespassing when they enter another person's property. Please be courteous to your neighbors and keep the cat at home.

Let's Keep Our Streets Neat!

Please be courteous of your neighbors and bring your trashcans in after trash has been picked up. Our CCR states that if trash or other refuse is to be disposed of by being picked up and carried away on a regular and recurring basis, containers must only be placed in the open on any day that a normal pick up is to be made, at such place on the property to provide access for persons making such pick up. At all other times such containers shall be stored in such manner that they cannot be seen from adjacent and surrounding property.

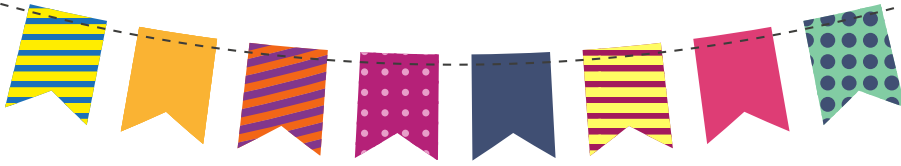

- Harvest all Catfish when caught. Note: Catfish compete with the bass for the limited food supply so please harvest. Thank you for helping to remove the Catfish.

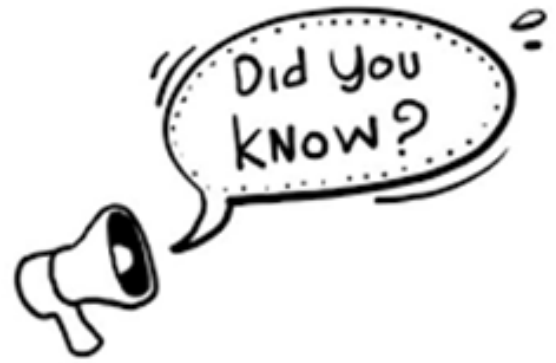

If you want to put up a fence, you are required to get approval from The Waters Architectural Review Board prior to the work being completed.

Did you know?

If you often forget to pay your quarterly HOA dues that you can sign up for ACH and have the funds automatically deducted from your account.

Winter Prep Cleaning Checklist

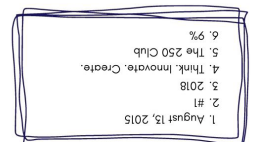
- Clean out the Pantry and wipe down shelves.

Dues Are Due

The Waters Assembly (Homeowners' Association) quarterly dues are due on or before the 15th of the beginning month of each quarter (January, April, July and October). **If you do not have a coupon to include with your payment, please write the Lot number and Address on your check.** If you do not have a coupon book, please contact Rachael Quinn at (334) 277-5551 or email rachael@thewatersal.com.

To better serve members of The Assembly, there are several payment options: (1) Checks can be mailed to **The Waters Assembly c/o Rachael Quinn, 2239 Marler Road, Pike Road, AL 36064.** (Please keep your cancelled check as your receipt for payment.) (2) Checks will be accepted at the Information Center during office hours Monday - Friday 8:00 am – 5:00 pm or by use of the after hours drop box. (The Assembly does not accept cash.) (3) Payment can be made by debit/credit card through a PayPal card reader or invoice. This payment option includes a 3.5% convenience fee. (4) Sign up for ACH recurring payments. This option is convenient and your payment is always on time (even if you're out of town). ACH forms are available on The Assembly website www.TheWatersAssembly.com and at the Information Center.

The Assembly is enforcing all rights and remedies allowed for the collection of delinquent dues. Finance charges will be assessed on all delinquent accounts. To avoid finance charges, attorney's fees and other collection enforcements, dues should be paid by the 15th of the month in which they are due. Valentine Day Treat - Chocolate Truffle with Sea Salt

Ingredients:

- 8 ounces, weight (up to 9 Oz.) Good Semisweet Chocolate
- 8 ounces, weight (up to 9 Oz.) Good Bittersweet Chocolate
- 1 can (14 Oz) Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 1 Tablespoon Vanilla Extract
- 8 ounces, weight Meltable Milk Chocolate
- Sea Salt

Instructions:

- Heat dark chocolates and condensed milk in a double boiler over medium low heat until chocolate is melted. Stir—mixture will have a slight marshmallow texture. Stir in vanilla.
- Remove from heat, cover and refrigerate for two hours.
- Once chilled, roll in balls, then roll in melted milk chocolate coating. Sprinkle with sea salt or other fine, coarse sprinkles.

Important Notices

Mailbox Keys – if at any time you need a mailbox replacement key, you will be charged \$30 key replacement fee to replace and/or re-key all necessary locks. Replacement mailbox keys can be obtained by contacting the Information Center at 334.277.5551. Please note that the HOA is at the mercy of the USPS for the timing on changing out locks as the USPS must grant access to the box for the replacement to be done.

Boat Launch – when using the boat launch, make sure that you lock the gate when you leave and clean up your trash, fishing supplies, etc.

Adenus /Alabama Wastewater Sewer – are you having trouble with your sewer service? Before you call a plumber, call the Adenus /Alabama Wastewater Maintenance Hotline at 877.453.3268.

Change, Change Everywhere Change – please remember to notify the Information Center if you change your email, phone number or mailing address. You can send changes to theassembly@thewatersal.com.

Volunteer Today – if you are interested in volunteering your time to help with any of The Waters Assembly seasonal activities (i.e. Easter Egg Hunt, Kids Club, etc.), please contact the Information Center for details on how you can get involved and volunteer.

Political Signs – political and/or advertising signs are not allowed in The Waters. Homeowners should not post political signs or allow contractors to place advertising signs in front, side, or rear yards. Only signs approved by The Waters ARB are allowed.

No Butts About It – please protect our beautiful neighborhood by properly disposing of cigarette butts. It is unsightly to see cigarette butts in the road and along our beautiful lake front. This is especially a problem around the lakes. Please take all trash, including cigarette butts with you from the lake shore.

Construction Areas – please do not allow children to play in construction areas. This is for their own safety. If you see children playing at a construction site, please contact HOA Management at 334.277.5551.

Neighbor Neighbor, Who are Thee? – there is a lot of change and growth happening in Pike Road and along the Marler Road corridor. If you are interested in learning more about what is happening in the area you can visit the Town of Pike Road Planning Commission meetings to hear details on plans as they are submitted. Stop Means STOP! – it is a simple concept, but many motorists seem to forget. There are other cars on the street, children, and pedestrians... take the time to do a full stop at a stop sign, no matter how much of a hurry you are in. It could save a life, or at the very least, costly damage to your vehicle if another car happens to also ignore that stop sign.
