

GOLF CARTS

If you have not received your 2024 golf cart permit, please stop by the Assembly office during business hours to obtain your new permit. Bring a current copy of your golf cart insurance if we do not have it on file. Golf Cart permits must be displayed on the front, lower left-hand corner of the golf cart.

If you sell your golf cart, please remove your golf cart permit from your golf cart.

Please do not allow anyone under the age of 14 to operate a golf cart. The Waters Assembly Rules and Regulations state that all golf cart drivers must be 14 years old or older and have gone through our resident orientation.

All passengers must be properly seated while the cart is in motion and may not be transported in a negligent manner or in a manner inconsistent with the cart manufacturer's recommendations. The number of passengers shall not exceed the seating capacity of the cart, including the driver.

Don't Fence Me In

How does your fence look? Fencing is as much a part of your home as your lawn. Each homeowner is responsible for the fence along both sides of their home, as well as in the rear. This includes keeping the fence in good repair, fixing fences damaged by wind and rain, and the general look of the fence (i.e. removing weeds and mildew). Please remember that The Waters Architectural Review Board or ARB requires that any and all exterior additions and / or changes must be approved PRIOR to commencement of the work.

Did you know that where fences come in contact with the soil there is a greater chance of rotting and decay occurring? Fencing that is only half a decade old may require replacing due to contact with garden soil. Double the life of your fence by keeping soil a good distance away from the wood. In cases where gardens and flower beds are located right up to the fence creativity may be necessary. If your fence is sprouting moss or looking dull and gray from mildew, a good scrubbing with a brush and diluted bleach, or a gentle power washing should do the trick. Paying attention to your fence now by performing routine maintenance should save time and money in the future.

Must Knows for Mowing, Tips for Trimming and Words of Wisdom on Weeds

- **Keeping a beautiful lawn.**

- Mow your lawn in a different direction with each mowing, especially with lawns of shorter grass types. Altering the direction ensures a more even cut since grass blades will grow more erect and will be less likely to develop into a set pattern. Keep blades sharp and keep several blades around so there is always a sharp one on hand. Apply weed control chemical applications or contract with a professional lawn service to control weeds. Trimming and edging your lawn puts the finishing touch on a beautiful lawn. Edging creates a vertical cut and trimming creates a horizontal cut – either method works and will add that manicured touch.

- **Trimming / Pruning plantings.**

- Hedges, trees or other plantings should be maintained in a way that is not unreasonably detrimental to an adjoining property. It should not obscure the view of the street, traffic or surrounding amenities or be unattractive in appearance. The best way to keep trimmed trees and shrubs healthy is to make sure that the trimming tools are sharp enough for trimming. Dull shears could injure foliage. Ripping branches may shock the foliage and dull shears will require more strength to cut through a branch.

- **Keeping weeds out of shrub and flower beds.**

- Hand-weeding is the oldest form of weed control and is still of great value in landscapes. It is most effective and easiest when plants are small. Hoeing can also effectively remove weeds. Hoeing should be shallow, so that the root systems of desirable plants are not disturbed. Another fast and effective method is to contract with a professional lawn service for chemical treatment of weeds. Landscape beds lose their curb appeal when weed growth surpasses shrub and/or flower growth.

- **Proper disposal of clippings, limbs, etc.**

- The Montgomery County Commission and AMWASTE offer free trash drop-off sites throughout the county on the last Saturday of the month. Pike Road's drop-off site is the County Maintenance Shop, located across Meriwether Road from the Feed Lot (near the intersection of Meriwether and Pike Roads) and Pike Road High School (Georgia Washington Campus). 
Tennis Court Bathroom

Report First, Post Second

For many people reporting suspicious or unusual activity on Facebook has become the norm. We've heard reports of residents posting things like, "Someone was swimming in the pool after it closed tonight." and "I saw a car full of kids fly out of the neighborhood this morning and they almost ran me off the road. How can we stop this?" We commend you on letting your neighbors know of suspicious or unusual activity. However, it does nothing to deter or prevent the activity if the proper parties are not informed. In order to help curb and deter those bad doers, always report first to the Sheriff's office (if necessary), then to the Homeowners Association (HOA) and then, if it is something that you need to let neighbors know about you go to Facebook. It would be good to indicate that you already called the Sheriff and/or notified the HOA when you post in a Facebook group. It will help set a precedent to other neighbors when they read your post! Let's all work together to keep our community the wonderful place it is.


Homemade Blue Raspberry Slushy

- 4 cups of cold water
- 1 cup of sugar
- 1 ½ tsp McCormick Raspberry Extra
- 4-6 drops McCormick Neon Blue Food Coloring

In a large bowl, combine water and sugar and stir until sugar is completely dissolved. Add in McCormick Raspberry Extract and stir well. Follow with 4-6 drops of McCormick Food Coloring to achieve your desired color. Stir well. Pour into your ice cream maker (this recipe was tested in a 1 and 1/2 quart ice cream maker) and turn on and run according to ice cream maker package directions. Let run for approximately 20 minutes or until desired consistency is reached. Serve immediately.

Quick Glance Map of Neighborhood Designations





POOL REMINDERS



Pool decks **MUST** be vacated by 10 PM. No swimming after 9 PM. Do not prop open the gates for any reason. This is a safety and liability issue.

ADDITIONAL REMINDERS:

- Access to the pool areas are by use of Resident Card only.
- Lucas Point pool opens daily at 7 AM and the Blue Heron Pool Club opens daily at 8 AM.
- Both pools close at 9 PM. No swimming after 9 PM.
- Pool decks must be vacated by 10 PM.
- Glass containers are not allowed in or around the pools.
- Food nor drinks are allowed within five (5) feet of the pools.
- Close umbrellas after usage.
- Remove all pool toys, floats, towels, etc. upon departure.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- **What are the HOA requirements to have a Golf Cart?** All the requirements for a golf cart are listed in the Rules and Regulations. Golf carts must be registered with the HOA and proof of insurance provided to the HOA. Only residents 14 and over who have attended resident orientation are permitted to drive golf carts.
- **What do photographers need to do to be able to take photographs in the community?** The HOA has a policy that photographers are required to receive a permit to take pictures within the community. We have a sign at the entrance directing photographers to check in at the Information Center. Photographers can look on our website, TheWatersAssembly.com to learn more about how to obtain a photography permit as well.
- **How do I get a Resident Card?** Contact the Information Center if you need a Resident Card. Resident Cards are issued for all residents 14 and over and are for access to the pool gates for all Assembly Members current on their Assembly Dues. All residents age 14 and over MUST attend our New Resident Orientation class before receiving their Resident Card.
- **What hours are the Information Center open?** The Information Center is open from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday.
- **How do I find out my Neighborhood Designation and who the Neighborhood Representative is for my neighborhood?** A map of Neighborhood Designations can be found on the website at TheWatersAssembly.com or please contact the Information Center for a map of the Neighborhood Designations. The Neighborhood Representative's contact information is included in The Waters Ledger Newsletter each quarter and can also be found on the website.
- **How do I get a copy of the Rules and Regulations?** Rules and Regulations can be found on the website at TheWatersAssembly.com, can be obtained at the Information Center or via email to Info@TheWatersAssembly.com.
- **Who do I contact for problems with utilities or garbage?** See the list included in the newsletter of Important Numbers.
- **Where do I send my HOA dues if I do not have a coupon?** If you do not have a coupon, checks can be brought directly to the Information Center during business hours, placed in the drop box behind the office after hours, or mailed to The Waters Assembly at 2239 Marler Road, Pike Road, AL 36064. Denote on your check the address so the payment is applied to the correct account. ACH, or an automatic draft, can also be set up by contacting our accountant via email at Rachael@TheWatersAL.com.
- **Who do I contact to rent The Chapel?** Laura Walter owns The Chapel and handles all rentals of The Chapel. She can be reached at (334) 922-9669.
- **How do I check out a boat?** A key lockbox for the boats is located at the Lucas Point Mail Center where Members can pick up and return the key with their Resident Card. Attending our boat class is required to obtain access to the boat keys. If you have not taken the Boat class, your Resident Card will not be activated for access to the boat key. Boats are available to be signed out five (5) designated times per day. This allows time in between use to charge the batteries. Please be courteous of your neighbors and allow times for all residents to sign up for the boats. Signing up for multiple times and keeping the boats out for longer than designated does not allow for other residents to use the boats nor does it allow time for the batteries to charge.
- **When is the boat class offered?** The Boat Usage and Safety Class will be offered the third Thursday of each month, 4:30 pm, at the Lucas Point Mail Center. Reservations are required. Also, to drive the boats, you must have a valid state driver's license, and be at least 16 years of age.
- **Is the boat class required to use the kayak and canoes?** The boat class is not required for kayaks and canoes. Reservations are not required, they are available on a first come, first serve basis. All children under 14 years old must be accompanied and supervised by an adult (18 years and older), at all times, to be allowed to use the kayaks and canoes. All boaters under the age of 14 years of age MUST wear a life jacket at all times, and everyone 14 and older is strongly encouraged to wear a life jacket.
- **Why is the grass in certain areas throughout the community allowed to grow tall?** There are areas throughout the community that the grass is allowed to grow tall. We then have it bush-hogged periodically throughout the year. This is done for a cost savings to the HOA.
- **Who do I call to reserve a tennis courts?** The tennis courts, pickleball courts and sports court may not be reserved. They are strictly on a first come, first served basis. There are 1-hour time limit for singles; 1 ½ hour time limit for doubles set for use of the courts.

Dues Are Due

(3) Payment can be made by debit/credit card through a PayPal card reader or invoice. This payment option includes a 3.75% convenience fee. (4) Sign up for ACH recurring payments. This option is convenient and your payment is always on time (even if you're out of town). ACH forms are available on The Assembly website www.TheWatersAssembly.com and at the Information Center.

The Assembly is enforcing all rights and remedies allowed for the collection of delinquent dues. Finance charges will be assessed on all delinquent accounts. To avoid finance charges, attorney's fees and other collection enforcements, dues should be paid by the 15th of the month in which they are due. IMPORTANT NOTICES

Does your home have address numbers?: If your home does not have an address that is appropriately marked, it can delay the response of first responders and make it difficult for packages to be delivered to your home. We also recommend you add numbers to the rear of your home, if you are served by alley.

Wildlife Sighting: The Alabama Game & Fish Division has been made aware of recent sightings of the alligator in Lake Cameron. Please review the following reminders and stress the importance of adhering to the guidelines with your children and/or guests.

- Alligators are an apex predator and survive on a diet of snakes, turtles, fish, wading birds, small mammals and any other free source of food. Although they have a primitive brain, they are very capable of learning to associate people with food. **DO NOT FEED THE ALLIGATOR REGARDLESS OF SIZE.** Once an animal becomes acclimated to being fed by humans they lose their natural fear of human activity. For this reason it is illegal to feed alligators. Violators can be fined and prosecuted.
- Do not discard fish heads, offal/entrails or other food wastes in or around the lakes. The fish cleaning station that was at the Marina has been removed. Residents are encouraged to bag fish heads or offal/entrails and place in the deep freeze until the morning of garbage pickup. **DO NOT DISCARD FOOD WASTES or FISH PARTS INTO THE LAKE.**
- Keep a watchful eye for pets that frequent the water's edge. Alligators do not differentiate between dogs and other natural prey items.
- Give a wide berth to any alligator on land or water. Do not approach or harass alligators. There have been reports of adults throwing rocks at the alligators. Approaching wildlife is harassment and violators can be fined and prosecuted.
- According to officials, the lake, over time, has developed an ecosystem to support alligators so we should remain on alert that there is always a possibility of alligators and other wildlife at The Waters.

The ARB is in place to ensure that exterior changes enhance our community without infringing on other properties. A copy of the ARB Application can be found on The Waters Assembly website in the "Forms and Documents" section.


