THE HISTORY OF

VETERANS DAY

It was at 11:00 am on November 11, 1918 that a temporary peace, or armistice, was signed and the fighting during World War I came to an end. A year later President Woodrow Wilson announced that November 11th would be called Armistice Day in the United States.

In 1938 Armistice Day became a national federal holiday. It was a day dedicated to world peace and held in honor of the veterans of World War I.

In 1954 Congress decided to change the day to Veterans Day. This was because they wanted to honor the veterans of all wars including World War II and the Korean War.

There were a few more changes to the day. In 1968 the day was moved to the fourth Monday of November. However, it was later changed back to November 11th in 1978 by President Gerald Ford.

The reason the cormorant birds are such a problem is because each bird can eat as much as one or two pounds of feeder fish a day and there can be as many as two thousand on the lake at one time. Please do not be alarmed if you hear the noise from the pyrotechnic guns.

PEPPERMINT POKE COKE

INGREDIENTS

1 box chocolate cake mix, plus ingredients called for on box

1 tsp. peppermint extract

2 1/2 c. marshmallow cream

1 tbsp. water

2/3 c. crushed candy canes, divided

2 c. Whipped topping

Chocolate fudge sauce, for garnish

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° and grease a 9"-x-13" pan. Prepare chocolate cake mix according to package directions with the addition of mint extract and bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 25 minutes.
- 2. Poke cake all over with a peppermint stick or the bottom of a wooden spoon. In a small bowl, microwave marshmallow cream and water for 1 minute, then stir until smooth. Stir in 1/3 cup crushed candy canes, then pour all over cake, making sure to fill the poked holes.
- 3. Frost cake with whipped topping and garnish with remaining crushed candy canes and fudge sauce. Serve.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

COSTUMES:

Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors. Choose face paint and make up whenever possible instead of masks, so as not to obstruct vision.

Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.

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When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

WALKERS:

Cross the street at corners, using crosswalks if available. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.

Put electronic devices down, keep head up and walk, don't run across the street.

Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing.

Always walk on sidewalks or paths.

Walk the most direct routes with the fewest street crossings.

Watch for cars that are turning or backing up.

Never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

DRIVERS:

SLOW DOWN and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods.

Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.

Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.

Get rid of any distractions – like your phone – in your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.

Turn your headlights on earlier than usual so you can spot children and children can spot you.

How to Prep Your Home for Fall

If only all the fall prep your home needed was a pumpkin spice candle and new wreath to hang on the front door! While those are nice touches to add to your home for the upcoming season, more needs to be done to ensure your home is ready for cooler temps. Here are some great tips to get your home ready for fall!

CHANGE AIR FILTER

This is one of the best ways to extend the life of your HVAC. Keep a fresh filter on hand and change it as directed. Another way to protect your HVAC is seasonal check-ups. Have a licensed HVAC specialist take a look at your system to keep it in optimal shape.

CHANGE BATTERIES

Change your smoke detector, carbon monoxide batteries and test the alarm. You never know when you'll need it and smoke detectors play a critical role in protecting your family from unforeseen harm. You'll want to change the batteries on an annual basis (or whenever you hear it start chirping) and test the alarm at least once a month.

CLEAN GUTTERS

Clean your gutters and clear leaves from around your exterior. Gutters are your home's first line of defense in flash floods as they divert rainwater away from your home. Gutters moving water away from the base of your home keeps rainwater out of your basement or crawl space. Fallen leaves not only deprive your lawn of sunlight during the fall and winter months, they also can weaken your root systems and can hold moisture for an extended time around the base of your home.

PROTECT OUTDOOR FAUCETS

Drain your outdoor faucets and place a foam faucet cover over the spigot. These are usually around \$1.00 from the hardware store and provide insulation during freezing temperatures. A good rule of thumb is to leave them covered when temperatures are expected to be below 30 degrees.

SEAL DRAFTY WINDOWS

Check your window and door seals and apply seals where necessary. Weather-stripping helps boost winter warmth and cuts energy costs by creating a better seal on your exterior openings, but in some instances, caulk may need to be used to seal cracks between the frame and a door or window.

FERTILIZE YOUR LAWN

If you want to keep your lawn looking great in the spring and summer, you need to prep it for the fall and winter. Roots are still active when the grass isn't growing, so applying fertilizer will prevent winter damage. Doing this is crucial in helping your lawn turn green faster in the spring.

CUT GRASS SHORT

Just this one time of the year, set your mower to cut 1-1/2 or 2-in. and mow your grass short. Tall grass blades won't lie down and smother the new grass next spring.

CLEAN AND INSPECT FIREPLACE

The right time to clean and inspect your fireplace is before you need to use it regularly. Grab a flashlight and look up inside your fireplace flue to make sure the damper opens and closes properly. Open the damper and look up into the flue to make sure it's free of birds' nests, branches and leaves, or other obstructions. You should see daylight at the top of the chimney. Now is also a great time to call a professional chimney sweep for maintenance!

Fire Safety Tips

The Pike Road Fire and Rescue Department would like to share/offer some fire safety advice. Readers should note that all fire situations are different and it is difficult to give fail-proof general advice. We believe the information contained on these pages may prove useful in some situations, however; additional safety measures may be required under particular circumstances.

Fires create tragedies every day. Educating the public on methods of fire prevention is one of the ways to assist in alleviating harm to your family and home. Education and knowledge on how to deal with potential dangerous situations makes one more confident if the need ever arises. Being prepared for emergencies could be the thing that saves you or someone in your family.

Practice fire drills in the home to make sure all family members know what to do in the event of a fire. Draw a floor plan with at least two ways of escaping every room. Make sure the plan shows important details: stairs, hallways, and windows that can be used as fire escape

Get out immediately, don't try to grab your possessions as they can be replaced. YOU CAN'T!

If you encounter smoke on your way out of the fire, crawl low under the smoke to your exit.

Feel all doors before opening them. If a door is hot, exit another way. If your clothes catch on fire, stop where you are, drop to the ground, cover your face with your hands to protect your face and lungs and roll over and over to smother the flames.

Have a pre-determined location for everyone in the home to meet so each person can be accounted for.

You should not place the 911 call to emergency services from inside the home. It is best to get out and place the call to fire authorities from a safe location outside the home such as a neighbor's home or use a cell

Provide as much information as possible to the dispatcher including the location of the emergency and what is burning. mail.pikeroadfire.com/fire-safety-tips.html
