There's Always Something Going On At The Smyrna Museum!

The DCHS has been busy and we've got a lot of things going on!

"The best time to repair the roof is when the sun is shining" (J.F. Kennedy)

We couldn't agree more!

- DCHS sold the lot on North Main Street to the Town of Smyrna.
- DCHS has filed for several Grants to help pay for operational expenses. We desperately need to replace the roof on the plank house and have some other maintenance needed, such as leak fixes, painting, etc.
- Microfilm of the Sun-Times newspaper (from March 1854 to June 1961) and Smyrna Town Minutes (from March 1845 to Sept 4, 1990) was professionally scanned into PDF files that can be read and searched electronically by computer. This allows capability to search the files for research purposes.
- DCHS, through Grant funding, will be making improvements at the Quaker Cemetery.
- DCHS will be partnering with the Smyrna Police Department on Smyrna Night Out and First Friday Night Out events. The First Friday Night Out events will be from May to September and the events are planned to be on Main Street, designed to bring interest to the downtown area. The museum will be open. If you're interested in volunteering on the Friday nights – give us a call and leave a message and event coordinators will contact you (302-653-1320).
 - The Smyrna Night Out will be Saturday, June 18th and will bring excited bands and music acts to Main Street, as well as food and drinks. Historical Fun Facts: Did You Know?



The 1906 "Minutemen" Calendar

This interesting large 1906 calendar card is part of the museum's Revolutionary War room display.

The Perry Mason Company in Boston, MA, published a weekly children's newspaper, the *Youth's Companion*, from 1827 to 1929. At first the newspaper targeted children and articles centered on religion. In later years the focus changed to children and adults and the articles featured famous writers such as Harriet Beecher Stowe and Mark Twain. Calendars were a subscription bonus, issued with the "New Year's greeting". The 1906 calendar card was billed as "a souvenir for 1906 is something wholly out of the ordinary". The three-paneled illustration is framed in gold leaf and the card is described as representing the "March of the Minutemen" and both "distinctive and patriotic".

On September 8, 1892, the *Youth's Companion* published the first copy of the Pledge of Allegiance, written by the Perry Mason Company staff member, Francis Bellamy.

Eric S. Gardner as a child was very fond of the magazine. When he embarked on his own writing career, Gardner borrowed the name Perry Mason for his famous fictional attorney-detective character.

Who knew?

SPRING IS IN THE AIR!

Now we just need some warmer temperatures so that it really feels like spring!

The propagated Camelia gave another spectacular show of colorful red and pink blooms a few weeks ago.

You can see red blooms towards the bottom of the shrub and then the blooms come out in pink as well.

This is most likely the winter blooming variety, adding color to a winter landscape. This shrub is known to get as tall as 10 feet and blooms in the northern area January to March.

There are six types of Camelia blooms, and this one looks similar to the *"Rose Form Double"*.

Whatever it may be, we think she's simply lovely!
