The Board of Directors is proud to present Lane as the 2022 Angler of the Year!

In our third season, we are proud to award the Angler of the Year trophy as a top honor for our competitors. This award is not only honored by tournament wins, but for participation in our monthly educational events, community events and volunteer opportunities.

Our 2022 Angler of the Year had an outstanding season on and off the water. On the water, Lane had an impressive five first place finishes and four other tournaments placing in the top five. Lane and Auggie placed fifth at the Iowa B.A.S.S. Nation Junior State Championship. He also found success on the national stage with partner Grant. The duo traveled to the Harris Chain of Lakes in Leesburg, Florida to bring home a 12th place finish. At Norfork Lake, they placed 15th. In their final appearance on the Bassmaster stage, Lane and Grant placed third at Saginaw Bay and brought home tournament big bass. Lane also won our Season Big Bass award with a 5.80 pound bass in the final 20 minutes at the John B. Schoondyke Memorial Tournament at Rathbun. In his second season, he made memories that will last a lifetime.

What is equally as impressive is Lane's dedication to fishing, community and conservation off the water. Lane completed all 12 education events, as well

as, completing the maximum number of volunteer hours. Lane served as a representative of the lowa Youth Fishing League at several community events. His dedication to maintaining a positive mental attitude were evident to all.

BUILDING PROGRAMMING

2022 allowed the Iowa Youth Fishing League to continue our goal of building high-quality sustainable programming opportunities to the youth of Iowa.

Due to the generosity of our sponsors we were able to continue to provide our virtual education pathway at no cost to participants. Anglers registered and received an event directly to their email. Our education pathway also partnered with The Ike Foundation to distribute over 100 tackle boxes to local youth.

In our tournament pathways, we were fortunate to offer an even larger tournament schedule feature new formats, bodies of water, and tournament duration. Our continued success in offering multiple pathways allowed our program to grow to over 100 angling families. Our tournaments saw larger turn-outs and family engagement. Offering multiple two-day tournaments was a huge hit, as well as, ending our season with a multi-species tournament at Clear Lake.

In 2022, the Iowa Youth Fishing League was able to:

- **g**row to the largest youth tournament fishing organization in the state.
- create new sponsorships, State Championship Partners, and relationships with community organizations.

CREATING OPPORTUNITIES:

The IYFL worked to ensure that we were maximizing opportunities for the youth anglers in our programming. This included providing more options for educational, conservation, and tournament access again this season. This included seeking out new partnerships with companies to provide the most authentic angling experiences.

For the second year, our anglers were nominated for the Bassmaster High School All-American. Kolby and Tyler were named to the Bassmaster All-State Fishing Team and advanced to the process for being name one of 12 All-Americans. Several teams traveled across the country to the compete in Bassmaster and Major League Fishing Opens. High School Angler, Matthew attended the WileyX Fishing Camp, as well as, the Bassmaster High School Combine.

We continued our partnership with our Title Sponser for our tournament trail Barracuda Fish Cleaning Stations. We worked to secure new partnerships and sponsorships. This year we saw continued growth and support for our State Championship Partners to support our 20 anglers that competed. We want to thank Ark Fishing Rods, X-Zone Lures, and Rod Gloves, as well as, Scheels and Bass Pro Shops for providing some amazing prizes at our end-of-season banquet.
