
tickets to the Bassmaster Junior and High School National Championship this summer. It will be a season we will never forget.

January

We kicked off the 2023 season.

Two teams traveled to the Bassmaster Open at the Harris Chain of Lakes in Florida.

March

April

Kolby caught the largest bass in IYFL history with a 6.04 pound largemouth.


A Year in Review

2023 Angler of the Year -- Junior Division

It is with great pleasure that the Board of Directors sends their congratulations to Lane as the 2023 Junior Angler of the Year. Lane is the first angler to win Angler of the Year back-to-back.

Lane's 2023 season saw great success. Lane and his fishing partner, Grady, kicked off their season by traveling to the Bassmaster Open at the Harris Chain of Lakes in Florida. This season, Lane brought home an impressive eight IYFL tournament wins with all other tournaments placing in the top five. He earned five division tourney big bass victories, as well. Lane and Grady were named the 2023 lowa B.A.S.S. Nation Junior State Champions, punching their ticket to the Bassmaster Junior National Championship in the summer of 2024. Lane's 4.02 pound largemouth secured the junior division big bass at the state championship. Lane earned the nickname, "Mr. Clutch" by his fishing partner and boat captain this season for catching several big fish in the last moments before weigh-in in multiple tournaments, showing a determination to never quit. Lane and Grady are also the 2023 Junior Division Team of the Year for their impressive season.

What is equally noticeable about Lane's commitment to furthering the mission of the lowa Youth Fishing League is his dedication to complete monthly education events, volunteer at community events, attend organizational events, and to complete volunteer hours in his free time. Lane's leadership was also appreciated in his role as the President of the Junior Division Club. His dedication to maintaining a positive mental attitude were evident to all. He is also the recipient of the 2023 Positive Mental Attitude Award after fishing

several tournaments with a broken arm.

2023 Angler of the Year -- High School Division Marshall N.

It is with great pleasure that the Board of Directors sends their congratulations to Marshall as the 2023 High School Angler of the Year.

Marshall's 2023 season saw him expanding his tournament career outside of the IYFL to pursue additional fishing opportunities. Marshall began his season by fishing the High School Bassmaster Open at Lake Chickamauga. At the lowa High School Bass Team Championship at Lake Macbride, Marshall and Reece placed third with 10.63 pounds. While attending the Major League Fishing/The Bass Federation/Student Angler Association State Championship, his team placed 11th. Marshall and Evan also placed fourth at the lowa B.A.S.S. Nation High School State Championship. This season, Marshall secured two tournament wins, three top three finishes, four top five finishes, and two top twenty finishes in IYFL hosted tournaments. Marshall also weighed in a 4.41 pound tournament big bass at Lake Macbride. Marshall and Reece are the 2023 High School Team of the Year and the first team to earn that honor back to back.

Marshall's dedication to growing his knowledge and technical skills were evident to all who attending the IYFL Mock Combine in preparation for the Bassmaster High School Combine. Marshall showcased his skills and placed consistently in all categories and finished second overall. Marshall completed all educational events this season, as well as completing his volunteer hours inside of our organization and in his community. He served as the President of our high school club and showed great leadership in planning and purchasing prize packages for the 2023 tournament trail for all anglers.



Giving Back

Anglers of the lowa Youth Fishing League volunteered approximately 76.5 hours back to the fishing community and their local communities. Anglers volunteered at summer camps, nursing homes, Department of Natural Resource Projects, and local fishing events. Anglers also gave time inside of the lowa Youth Fishing League to help with tournament operations and preparing for education, community, organization and conservation events throughout the 2023 season.



Building Programming

The 2023 season provided yet another year of providing high-quality and sustainable programming focused on fishing and conservation for lowa youth.

Our education pathway had opportunities for more in-person events, as well as, an more in-depth learning experience in our virtual events. We partnered with Scheels in West Des Moines for an education event in their store where anglers talked about boat electronics and the retail industry. Our annual tackle box giveaway in partnership with The Ike Foundation distributed another 100 tackle boxes into lowa communities.

Our two tournament pathways saw great success this season. We watched our season big bag record get crushed at Stop #2 at Lake Belva Deer on Mother's Day. Our season big bass record was broken, not once, but twice this season. Our teams set new goals and achieved new accomplishments locally at tournaments and on the national stage. We traveled to new bodies of water and held more two-day tournaments. Our program continued to grow past 100 fishing families and our family tailgates grew significantly. The IYFL was present in new communities and has reached 54 lows towns and over 50 school districts.

Achieving Goals

The 2023 season allowed our organization to reach and set new goals moving forward.

This season we put a large emphasis on providing more educational opportunities in-person, as well as increasing the rigor of our virtual learning. Our anglers had the opportunity to attend three in-person events to practice skills, gain new information, and showcase their skills. Throughout the year, anglers focused their learning on techniques, bait selection, giving back to our communities, and sharing their passion for fishing with others.

In June we hosted West Des Moines Community Schools' Summer Scholar program at Raccoon River for an afternoon of fishing. Our anglers collaborated with 30-40 kindergarten through eighth grade newcomers to teach them the basics of fishing from the docks. Many first fish were caught and it was as truly amazing experience for all.

The generosity of donors during the Friends of the IYFL campaign allowed for us to scholarship more anglers this season than ever before. We are grateful to continue expanding that campaign in future season.

This season, the lowa Youth Fishing League worked to build stronger connections and relationships with collegiate angling programs. We are proud to announce that Kolby has signed his letter of intent to fish with the University of Motevallo and Matthew has signed to fish with Murray State College. Both anglers were able to meet serveral colleges and universities while attending the Bassmaster High School Combine.





Creating Opportunities

We are grateful for our many continued partnerships into the 2023 season to allow us to create new opportunities for our angling families and our community. Their continued support allowed our organization to maximize programming. We welcome new partners, new supporter and new communities.

For the third year in a row, several anglers were nominated for the honor of Bassmaster High School All-American. Matthew and Evan were named to the Bassmaster All-State Fishing Team. Several teams competed in Bassmaster and Major League Fishing National Opens. Tyson attended the WileyX Fishing Camp. Five high school anglers attended the Bassmaster High School Combine.

Our continued partnership with our title sponsor of our tournament trail Barracuda Fish Cleaning Stations allowed for more two-day tournaments and new bodies of water fished in 2023. Our partnership with Scheels created new opportunities for our anglers and families to learn about electronics and the retail side of fishing. Bass Pro Shops - Altoona provided new opportunities for our club leadership to create prize packages for the 2023 tournament trail. We witnessed continued growth with our State Championship Partners again this season to create swag bags for our anglers, boaters, and volunteers, as well as, family travel bags.





