

Building Programming

The 2024 season was another incredible year of delivering high-quality, sustainable programming focused on fishing and conservation for lowa's youth.

Our education pathway continued to thrive, offering both in-person events and expanded virtual learning opportunities. High school angler Tyson played a key role in creating our virtual events as part of his volunteer hours, giving participants a deeper, more flexible learning experience. In April, anglers across our organization took part in The Great Global Cleanup, and through our annual tackle box giveaway with The Ike Foundation, we distributed another 100 tackle boxes into lowa communities.

Our tournament pathways saw incredible success this season. The season big bag record was shattered at Okoboji in June, with junior anglers weighing in five fish for 22.31 pounds. The season big bass record was also broken at Okoboji with a 6.26-pound largemouth. Our anglers set ambitious goals, reached new milestones both locally and nationally, and competed on new bodies of water, including more two-day tournaments.

With over 120 fishing families, the IYFL community is stronger than ever. Our family tailgates grew, and we expanded into 30 counties and 48 school districts, making an impact in even more communities. It was a season of growth, success, and unforgettable moments, and we can't wait to see what's next!

Achieving Goals

The 2024 season was a year of growth, achievement, and setting new goals for the future of the lowa Youth Fishing League.

We placed a strong emphasis on elevating our virtual learning, giving anglers the opportunity to hone their skills, expand their knowledge, and share their passion for fishing. Throughout the year, they focused on techniques, bait selection, conservation efforts, and community service, reinforcing the values that make our organization special.

On the national stage, our anglers made their mark like never before. For the first time in IYFL history, we had anglers compete at the Bassmaster Junior and High School National Championships at Lake Chickamauga in Dayton, Tennessee. Juniors Lane and Grady finished 31st in late July, while high school anglers Alex and Carter placed 207th in early August. Another first for our organization was a junior division appearance at The Bass Federation National Championship and World Finals. Grady and Collin qualified by placing second at the state championship, but with both national events overlapping, Grady had to make a tough choice. Collin partnered with Holden, and together, they placed 2nd in the Northern Division at the National Championship and 5th in the World Finals. Our high school duo, Kaden and Owen, showcased their talent at the Bassmaster High School Opens, earning 15th place at Sam Rayburn and 12th at Saginaw Bay—proving they can compete with the best.

This year, we also strengthened our relationships with collegiate angling programs, opening new doors for our anglers to continue their fishing careers. We are incredibly proud to announce that Evan has signed with Carson-Newman University, Kaden with Erskine College, and Owen with Wabash Valley College. Several of our anglers also had the chance to connect with collegiate coaches at the Bassmaster High School Combine, helping to shape their future in competitive fishing.



Creating Opportunities

The 2024 season was a testament to the power of partnerships and community support, allowing us to create new and exciting opportunities for our anglers and their families. We are incredibly grateful for our continued sponsors and supporters who help us maximize our programming and expand our reach. This year, we welcomed new partners, new supporters, and new communities, further strengthening the impact of the lowa Youth Fishing League.

Our anglers rose to every challenge this season, proving they belong among the best. Several teams competed in Bassmaster and Major League Fishing National Opens, and five high school anglers attended the Bassmaster High School Combine to connect with collegiate programs. Three teams earned spots at National Championships, and at the 2024 lowa B.A.S.S. Nation Junior and High School State Championship, we traveled with more teams than ever before. High school teams Carter & Alex and Evan & Grant proudly punched their tickets to the 2025 Bassmaster National Championship.

This season pushed our anglers to new heights, and they delivered in a big way. We hosted multiple two-day tournaments, adjusted schedules to fish new bodies of water, and faced tough weather conditions. Through it all, our anglers showed determination and skill, competing in a ten-tournament season that saw 1,040 fish weighed in at a total of 2,271.91 pounds. Seven of those tournaments recorded big bass weighing five pounds or more—a true testament to the level of competition.

Our strong partnerships made these milestones possible. Thanks to our tournament trail title sponsor, Barracuda Fish Cleaning Stations, we successfully hosted multiple two-day tournaments. Our continued partnership with Scheels-West Des Moines ensured our anglers had access to top-quality prizes and equipment. We also saw sustained support from our State Championship partners, helping provide swag bags for anglers, boaters, and volunteers, as well as family travel bags.


Championship Partners
