





HIGHLIGHTS AND SUCCESS Stories in 2022

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

We have been fortunate to work with the skilled volunteers from Washington University School of Occupational Therapy and School of Physical Therapy, Children's Hospital, the Rotary Club of Ballwin, Parkway United Church of Christ, Hauk Kruse and Associates, Our Savior Lutheran Church of Wisconsin, Sigma Phi Epsilon, and Grabber Construction Products.

We are seeing steady referrals from individual word of mouth and we are proud to help serve referrals from local organizations such as SSM Health, Paraquad, Children's Hospital, Delta Center, Ranken Jordan Pediatric Bridge Hospital, Washington University School of Occupational Therapy, and MediEquip, Inc.

CHANGING LIVES

Ben: For our GHSP volunteers it was a great weekend of hard work, laughs, and giving back! For Ben, a Korean war veteran, it was a new lease on life when we headed out to Warrenton to build a ramp for him. This was Ben's first time being outside in a few months, and he and his loved ones were so excited to get out into the community once again.



Lebria: Lebria is a young woman who was working to regain function after a 3 month hospital stay. The addition of her ramp will allow for her to be safely transported to therapy

DONORSHIPS AND CONTINUOUS LEARNING

We have continued to explore new opportunities to provide 'more' where needed. Customized solutions have led us to new partnerships with community vendors and donors who have helped us provide aluminum access ramps, and raw lumber for decking. Building more organizational partnerships have helped us create organized 'volunteer days' and specialized volunteer engagement that serve persons within our community. Many times we add to these experiences with water management and grading, raking leaves, installing grab bars, or completing a little yard beautification. We have been fortunate to learn from similar organizations by joining their work and attending accessible building conferences to network solutions.



CLIENT FEEDBACK

Our youngest board members have been the drivers of a new consumer feedback process with follow up calls and we have gathered results shown here.

SAFETY

We are proud to say in the past <u>3 Years</u> follow up our clients are <u>89% Fall Free</u> since their ramp installation, and modifications we provided *decreased time* to enter/exit their home to 5 minutes or less.

HOW YOUR SUPPORT HELPS

Our ramps are constructed with extensive planning, permits, and design to meet all Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines for accessibility. Materials are high-grade lumber and, in some cases, more portable aluminum ramp options to meet the unique needs of each home.
