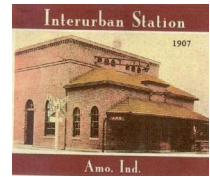

“In the language of the Society of Friends to ‘lay down’ is to end when the work is completed. The Amo Friends Church was laid down in February (of 2017), but its work will continue to benefit the citizens of the town.... When the congregation decided it was time to lay down the meeting and close the church, the work of this small group of Friends was not done. They donated the building to the First Baptist Church of Amo and plans are underway to use the building as a food pantry.” (Excerpts copied from Pastor Shelly Zook’s article in March 9, 2017, edition of THE REPUBLICAN.)

After many hours of planning, lots of love, and many months of sweat and work, The Storehouse Food Pantry opened its doors on Saturday, October 21, 2017, serving 3 families. The next month the number expanded to 10 families. The Storehouse Food Pantry is open on the 2nd Saturday of each month from 10:00 a.m. to Noon to receive financial or food item donations. On the 3rd Saturday of each month the Pantry is open from 10:00 a.m. to Noon to serve the Clay Township community. Financial contributions may be made to The Storehouse Food Pantry and mailed to P.O. Box 75, Amo, IN 46103, or by dropping off the donation during the Pantry’s open hours.

Now a little over a year later, The Storehouse Food Pantry is serving an average of 8 – 10 families each month. Pictured in the Pantry in November of 2018 are some of the dedicated volunteers: From left--Lynn Smedley, Jeanne Bryant, Jean Ellen Travelsted and Sharon Bruce.

The Storehouse Food Pantry also col-

lects used shoes for *Changing Footprints* whose Mission is: “Changing Footprints realizes the great need for shoes in our own community and around the world. We collect previously-worn and new shoes for distribution to homeless, disaster-stricken, and underprivileged people at home and abroad, regardless of race, religion, gender or ethnicity.” *Changing Footprints* accepts shoes of ANY kind, ANY size, ANY condition.



Shoes are then donated locally, across the United States and to 17 countries overseas. Damaged shoes that cannot be used are converted into playgrounds!

Another ministry of the Trinity Center is the Chapel. The Chapel, which officially opened last fall, has already had two weddings. Wedding Coordinator for the Trinity chapel is Dena Travelsted, who can be reached at 317.379.5977. There is a minimum of \$250 suggested donation for use of the Chapel; that fee does not include payment of clergy and a \$50 non-refundable fee to book the facility. All proceeds benefit Trinity Center ministries. Seating capacity is approximately 100 with room for additional seating in the back of the Chapel (maximum approximately 150). A sound system is provided for pre-recorded music. There is a dressing room for the bridal party. Wedding Clergy must be approved by the Pastor and Deacon board of the First Baptist Church of Amo until the Trinity Center board is put into place.

While working as a Correctional Officer at the Youth Center in Plainfield, Gene met Sue Tomblin Gasper where she was working as a Correctional Officer as well. They married in 1995. Gene gained two more

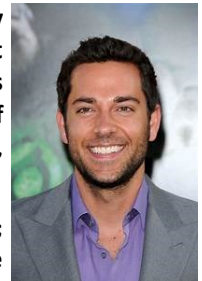

Levi starred in the lead role of Georg Nowack in the 2016 Broadway revival of She Loves Me opposite Laura Benanti, for which he received a Tony Award nomination. In 2010, Levi voiced Flynn Rider in the animated film Tangled, in which he performed the duet "I See the Light" with Mandy Moore; the song won a Grammy for Best Song Written for Visual Media. He later reprised the role in the short film Tangled Ever After, and returned to voice Flynn Rider again in a Disney Channel television series based on the film in 2017. In October 2017, he was cast as the title character in DC Films' Shazam!, as a part of the DC Extended Universe. The film is scheduled to be released April 5, 2019.
