MILITARY BANNERS

The Wa-Pe-Ke-Way Chapter National Society Daughters of the American Revolution is accepting orders for military banners to be displayed from May 2026 to May 2027 on downtown area street light poles. The chapter has partnered with Amo, Bainbridge, Brownsburg, Clayton, Danville, Lizton, North Salem, Pittsboro, Plainfield, Roachdale and Stilesville for banners. The banners are for any veteran (living or deceased who was honorably discharged) or active military individual. The chapter reserves the right to see DD214. If the individual died while serving our country, a gold star will be placed on the banner. When the banners are removed, they are given to the participant. Banner orders are taken on a first come first serve basis, with approved photo (in uniform) and payment of \$125.00.

As we approach the milestone celebration of America's 250th anniversary, in recognition of this historic occasion, the chapter is also offering a new, optional banner honoring Revolutionary War patriots who fought for our independence. These banners would be offered in addition to the traditional military banners to residents wishing to honor a Revolutionary War Patriot. Following the same standards of proof required for our existing military banners, the chapter would verify the individual's service as a true patriot during the Revolutionary War. The Patriot banner depicts the patriot's name and state in which they served.

KEEPING YOU IN THE LOOP



Dear Resident:

We have installed a new notification system called REACH. This system allows us to immediately share important information to you from the town, police and fire department. It is easy, and it is free to you. It is a service that the Town is paying for.

- 1. Go to www.V2.reachalert.com and enter Amo in the select a network box and click on our name when it appears.
- 2. Enter your name then enter your text phone #. If you do not have free text, then it also will allow you to enter an e-mail or a call phone number.
- 3. Under the text number you can enter other numbers also, if you want your spouse or children to have access to our alerts.
- 4. At the end it has a place for your physical address. This is IMPORTANT to enter so we know which houses are on the ALERT.

It only takes about a minute to sign up. Please to those that already have REACH, encourage your neighbors!

TOWN HIGHLIGHTS FROM TOWN MEETINGS AUGUST, SEPTEMBEAR, OCTOBER 2025

AUGUST

The Community Crossing Matching Grant work was completed. This grant allowed the Town to pave North Street from Vine Street across Pearl street to the Dead End.

Greg Burch painted the Propane Tank at the Community Building.

The Interurban History Museum/Reading Room received a \$3,100.00 grant from the Hendricks County Community Foundation Amo High School Alumni Association Education Fund.

Reach Alert to notify residents of events/emergency situations is in place and working well.

SEPTEMBER

The Public Hearing for the 2026 Budget was held.

Emmett Lencke with Eagle Scout Troop 301 is working on a badge. He will be installing a U.S. Flag Retirement Collection Box at the Interurban. Anyone needing to propertly dispose of a U.S. Flag can drop it in the box.

The property on Vine Street was purchased on September 20, 2024. The year wait on the tax sale will be over on September 20, 2025. The Council will be looking at different ideas for this property.

Halloween Hours were set for October 31, 2025, 5:00-8:00 PM.

OCTOBER

The 2026 Budget was adopted.

The AIM Conference is being held at in French Lick this month. Donna Watson, Barb Strahl and Becky Rhea will be attending.

The Town now owns the Chris Mitchell Garage property. The Council is considering our options.

Rhonda Beck of the Wa-Pe-Ke-Way Chapter of the DAR attended the Council meeting and presented details of the 2026-2027 Military Banner program. The Council approved participation for the Town of Amo. (Please see details on page 2.)

Next year will be the 25th anniversary of 9/11/2001. 2026 will be the last year for our 9/11 Dinner.

VANDALIA TRAIL — Please use the Trail!

The Vandalia Trail restrooms in Amo and Coatesville will be closed by the Hendricks County Parks & Recreation maintenance team for the winter, beginning sometime in November. The specific closure date will depend on the weather. Re-opening is scheduled for April 1st.

This summer, Hendricks County Parks & Recreation opened a new section of Vandalia Trail on the west side of the Town of Clayton. This first phase includes a trailhead in Lambert Park connected with a short section of trail along the north side of CR 500 S to Michigan Street on the west edge of Clayton. Additional planning is in process for the next phase of trail construction on the 2 miles of Hendricks County Parks & Recreation corridor to the west.

The weekly group bike rides by Friends of the Vandalia Trail have finished for the year, but please join the group's monthly rides through the winter on Plainfield's Vandalia Trail. The first two dates are November 8 and December 13, leaving at 9:00 AM from the southeast corner of the Meijer parking lot with a breakfast stop afterwards.




