

TOX-AWAY DAYS HENDRICKS COUNTY SOLID WASTE

"Our third Tox-Away Day for 2020 will be held at Hickory Elementary School in Avon, (907 Avon Avenue) on Saturday, July 11, 2020, from 8 am to 1 pm. Please enter the event from Avon Avenue. Tox-Away Days are opportunities for Hendricks County households to properly recycle or dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW), tires, electronics & appliances. All HHW (chemicals, auto fluids, fluorescent bulbs, batteries, pesticides, herbicides, medicines, sharps, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, etc.) is accepted from households free of charge. Latex paint should not be brought to Tox-Away Day for disposal. Instead, dry it out & throw it away. Fees are charged for the recycling of TV's (\$20/\$25), appliances (\$5/\$10) and tires (over a certain number). Cash & check accepted."

Care and passion are words that come to mind when talking with Willard Lydick about his 40+ years of helping oversee the Amo Cemetery.

Willard was coaxed into joining the Cemetery Association by Morris Newby years ago when Morris was ready to step back from the board. After being Chair for 27 or 28 years, he stepped down in 2019; however, he continues on the Board. The current Amo Cemetery Association includes: Tim Baldwin, Chair; Barb Strahl, Secretary/Treasurer; Willard Lydick and Mark Belford. Past members have included Harry Lambert, Harley Brown, Ed Jackson, Richard Eyler, Bob Greenlee, Roger Carter, Leorn Davis, Morris Newby, Jerry Stephenson. Names also found were of a Harmon, Masten and Edwards. After Jim Carter retired he mowed the cemetery grounds for several years.

There are over 1,000 graves in the cemetery which is divided into three parts: The east section is referred to as Carter; center section is Carter 2nd; west is Phillips. In the east section there are several graves of Veterans from the Civil War (1861-1865). The south section which is not yet open for lots, will be the Willard Lydick section. In the 1980's someone did a class research paper. They determined the first grave was in 1806.

As you can imagine, there is a lot of time and care that goes into the maintenance of the grounds. Willard mows the south section and Willard's daughter, Sharon Lydick Anderson, and Don Wingler maintain the remainder of the cemetery grounds. Willard expressed that he is proud of the good job that Sharon and Don do!

AMO CEMETERY (Continued)
