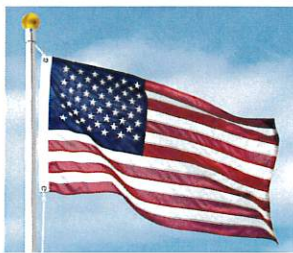

NOVEMBER, 2025

Amo Master Park Plan was received for review.

The Museum is moving along and we encourage you to visit it.

The Town applied for a Community Crossings Grant.

Residents are encouraged to sign up for REACH Alert if you have not done so. Contact Donna Watson for more information.

The Town of Amo now owns the old Mitchell garage, and plans for a small park is being discussed. The Town will get a survey and a group for ideas on this property for moving forward.

The Title VI Implementation Plan is now complete.

The Town of Amo ADA Transition Plan is now complete.

The Town donated a couple of raffle baskets for the Mill Creek West basket raffle. These baskets raise funds for 5th grade, THRIVE and the Backpack Ministry.

DECEMBER, 2025

The Amo Park Master Plan 2025-2029 was presented for approval. The Park Board has made all necessary additions and corrections. They will discuss future plans for fundraising for the park.

The Museum has compiled some photos from Jackie Eggers' estate into a scrapbook which may be viewed at the Museum. We continue to have many Amo history items donated. Please stop by. The Museum Committee voted to frame a page layout from THE REPUBLICAN newspaper about Cascade Football winning state to be presented to them.

The Town of Amo has been selected by INDOT to receive a Community Crossings Grant. This grant will cover 2 areas—East Street from South Street to Church Street and then Church Street to Walnut Street. Amount of the grant will be 80% of project at \$42,536.80, and the Town's portion coming in at \$10,634.20.

It was announced that the 2026 Amo Fire Department & Cascade Youth League Fish Fry will be June 4, 5, 6.

1. Go to www.V2.reachalert.com and enter Amo in the select a network box and click on our name when it appears.
2. Enter your name then enter your text phone #. If you do not have free text, then it also will allow you to enter an e-mail or a call phone number.
3. Under the text number you can enter other numbers also, if you want your spouse or children to have access to our alerts.
4. At the end it has a place for your physical address. This is IMPORTANT to enter so we know which houses are on the ALERT.
