<u>The Pastor's Pen</u>

The season of Lent officially began on Wednesday, February 22. Over these next 40 days, we will be diving into scripture to discover where we can seek and experience the love of God.

"Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word lencten, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection" (umc.org).

During these next 40 days, I pray you will find ways to connect with God. On Ash Wednesday, you were given a bag of scrabble letters to find the word "love" and invited to build off of this word to discover where you find love in your everyday life. If you did not get a bag, please stop by the office or pick one up on Sunday. You are welcome to swap letters or pick up more at any time.
