PRAYING FOR WHAT'S NEXT

As most of you know, Tina and I will be moving back to the Springfield area to be close to our family at the end of June. This was a decision that we spent a lot of time praying and thinking about for us and the girls. But, that doesn't mean we stop thinking about how the church moves forward and I believe in being intentional as a body of people.

As we prepare for what's next at Broadway, let's be intentional in our prayer for the future. Below is a prayer guide to use daily over the next few months.

1. **Read Scripture**

John 4:4-42, Luke 7:36-50, and Luke 19:1-10. Each of these passages tells us the stories of real life people. Each one shows how we can be broken and how we can be forgiven for our mistakes through God's love. Jesus came to seek and save that which was lost. Pray for new people to come to know Christ.

2. **Pray for the next Pastor**

As we prepare for a new season of ministry, pray for the new pastor and their family as they prepare to partner in ministry with Broadway. Pray for inspiration, a new anointing, and that they might be cared for as they come to this new place in ministry.

3. **Pray for our characteristics we are looking for.**

As we talked last Sunday, the leadership thought through what we hope for in the next pastor at Broadway. We are praying for:

- A. A spiritual leader.
- B. Someone who doesn't settle for status quo, willing to push and stretch the church.
- C. A Good preacher/communicator, motivational and growth-minded.
- D. Someone willing to be active in what the church is already doing and willing to be present and active in the community.

4. **Pray For Our Community**

The church is not a building; the church is a group of people. We are God's people, chosen to reach out to others in our own neighborhood and across the globe. Remember those we share life with, and those our church will reach with a message of welcome, comfort, hope and life.

Similar to the Ringers the music selected for the Tour of Churches pushed musical limits and taught the ensembles new aspects of counting and singing challenges. Just wait until Easter morning, when they sing Mozart's "Ave Verum Corpus" in the original Latin, talk about a new challenge. While our choir may be small the effort and performance that they bring is anything but. Their hard work and dedication are amazing!

I would be completely remiss for not recognizing a woman who has dedicated years of her life to our church lending her awesome skills tickling those ivories. Kathy Mattke has been an amazing asset to our congregation and to my first two years here at Broadway. I really couldn't do my job without her. I know I speak for our entire ensemble and our congregation as a whole that Kathy your skills and contribution to our spiritual uplifting through music will be greatly missed, even though your shining smile will still continue to bless us.

Finally, while we have not yet figured out the full solution to losing Kathy we have been given a gift with a new addition to our musical family. To help our congregation grow and move forward, while maintaining our traditions, Thomas Evans has joined our newly transformed Worship Band in addition to our bedrock players Ken and Craig. Over the next year newer contemporary Christian worship music will be infused into our Sunday service not only as the praise songs at the beginning of our service but throughout as well. VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL


