The Tastor's Ten

Over the past several weeks, I have enjoyed being back in worship with you as we have dove into the Psalms. Since the beginning of June, life has been one wild ride as we have welcomed Naomi into our home, I have officially been ordained as an Elder in full connection in the UMC, and we have tried to navigate the ever changing world of COVID-19. I have experienced a rollercoaster of emotions from joy to anger to sadness as we have been witness to racial injustice, civil unrest, heated (and perhaps unhealthy) debate, fractured relationships, rising unemployment, wildfires and hurricanes, and rising death tolls. It has been difficult to know what to say and who it is safe to say it to. I believe the heart of the Gospel is a message of reconciliation, and ultimately, the acts on the Cross occurred so that we might find right relationship with God and with each other. The climate we find ourselves today hasn't cultivated the best environment for coming together. In fact, it seems to be driving us farther apart. At my Ordination service, the pastor the pastor preached from Colossians 3:10-13:

Clothe yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all! As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

Friends, in this season, it is easy to become discouraged, to pull away, and to divide from those with whom we disagree. We can become bitter and say things that cause one another harm. Instead, let us be reminded of these words: when we are renewed by God, we are no longer divided, we are ALL in Christ. Be compassionate, kind, humble, meek, and patient. Show God's grace and extend the love of Christ.

Riding across Missouri in support of the Mozambique Initiative

Moto Rally for Mozambique

September 19-20, 2020

Motorcycles play a critical role for the transportation of pastors in rural communities. Many pastors do not have access to transportation and have to walk miles to each of their churches. The MI Moto Rally hopes to raise awareness and funds to purchase motorbikes in country and supply them to pastors in need.

Bishop Farr will lead riders on two separate rides through Missouri on September 19-20, 2020, to help raise money for motorcycles in Mozambique. The cost of a motorcycle in Mozambique is \$2,500.

Moto Rally for Mozambique

Join Missouri Bishop Bob Farr as he travels around the Missouri Conference on his Harley in support of the Mozambique Initiative. The purpose of the ride is to raise money to purchase motorcycles for United Methodist pastors in Mozambique. In remote areas that lack good roads, motorcycles are the most common and practical form of transportation. Motorcycles can help pastors with multiple charges serve their congregations more effectively. For the Missouri ride, supporters are encouraged to donate per mile ridden. The ride in Missouri will take place September 29 – October 2 and will pass through all nine Missouri Conference districts.
