Thank you to all that have given to the Plattsburg Food Pantry, your donations have made a huge difference for those in need.



In youth group and through the church we have been talking about it for months – and Mission Week finally came in June! Despite an interesting weekend leading into the event, including extended power outages throughout the town, we came together to begin the week on a perfect note. Combining with the group from Cameron UMC, we began with some silly get-to-know-you games, we had a taco party, and our first night of worship. It was clear by the end of the first night that we were all going to become quick friends. On Monday and Tuesday, we all worked in the Plattsburg community. Part of the group went to the house of a member of our community with the goal of overhauling her back yard. We trimmed trees and bushes and pulled vines and weeds – and took about 15 truck beds full to the dump. In the end – you can truly see the difference! The rest of the crew worked closely with the city to assist in storm clean up. After the storm that rolled through the previous Friday our help was greatly needed. Starting in several parks, we were able to fill several trailers full of downed branches (and sometimes entire trees). Once the parks looked better, we moved on out to the community, offering tree cleanup through the town and spreading love to everyone we met.

On Wednesday, we moved up to Cameron and got to work on a variety of projects. One group stayed at church and worked to create and build the start of a community garden. A second group went to a large park only a few blocks from the church and worked on park benches – scraping and staining all the benches and wooden picnic tables. Finally, a third group went to the Cameron Food Pantry and assisted with sorting and restocking. On Thursday, with much of the work complete on Wednesday (because our youth are AMAZING!!!) almost the entire group went to help with a drive-thru food drive. In the matter of about 3 hours, we helped feed 245 families which in total is 774 people! That afternoon we braved the heat one more time and went down to the Cameron Recycling Center to help walk the surrounding fields to pick up debris. Each evening we returned to the host church for fellowship, dinner, and worship to end the night.

The theme for the week was Shattered. Through worship each night and devotionals through the day, we were called to take a look at many aspects of our world and lives. We were reminded that much of what the world tells us are lies, fears, and deceptions, that prevent us from having a complete relationship with Jesus Christ. We were called this week and as we return to our lives, to mark those aspects of our lives that are holding us back and to SHATTER them to make more room for God to work within us.

Huge thank you to everyone who helped to make this event possible! To those who donated groceries, donated money, and those who gave up their time to help make this event possible – thank you from the bottom of my heart.
