


Youth Mission Trip:

July 7 through July 13 the youth group traveled to Cleveland, OH for our bi-annual mission trip! A total of 7 youth and 3 adults embarked on the 12-hour drive, ready to be the hands and feet of Christ in Cleveland. As we entered into Cleveland, we did not really know what to expect, but we left feeling energized and inspired. Through our week, we got to meet and work with Mittie Imani Jordan (known as Miss Mittie). Miss Mittie, along with St. Matthew's United Methodist Church, is working to restore, revitalize, and develop their neighborhood known as Brookdale. The plans include improving the appearance of the neighborhood, creating community space, developing community gardens, and the creation of the Brookdale Orchard. Ultimately a building selected in the heart of the area will be renovated to include classroom space for learning agricultural skills and business skills, a café, and a production facility to take the produce of the orchard to create a line of jams, jellies, juices, and pastries. All of this will create jobs for people of the neighborhood who may not be able to find work otherwise. It is such an amazing ministry and I count us so blessed to have played a small part in it. During our week we worked on several projects including clearing out an overgrown lot to make way for more fruit trees, building a storage area which will house project equipment, mowing, gardening, building boxes for raised garden beds, and creating our own Codes of Freedom fence. In addition to our work projects, we also took the time to explore a little bit including visiting the Cleveland Cultural Gardens, Trinity Cathedral, and Cedar Point in Sandusky, OH.

As we drove home from Cleveland, I asked the group to reflect on their week. I asked them to think about what it meant to them, what they enjoyed, and what they will take from this experience. Here are some excerpts from their responses:
