Each word will be presented with the actual word itself. It's part of Street....Part of speech and the first clue. Following that there will be two more clues. Each should hopefully get him closer and closer to the definition, but we will see how good I am at giving clues.

Unfortunately yes, yeah yes I am.

OK, so your first word is snood.

00:01:05 Bri

It is a noun.

00:01:07 Layne

For reference, she handed me a paper that just says snood with the capital all in capitals.

Yeah, and then it's got a lower case N for now in case you forget and then your first clue is hair.

Is it a hairstyle now? I can't say anything, so I'm just gonna blow through questions.

So what do you think a snood is?

I wanna say it's a hairstyle.

OK, can you like describe what kind of hairstyle that would be?

I'm imagining anything from a doctor Seuss book. The who's?

Yes.
