

Hearts and Hands of Kittitas County services transferred to Kittitas County Health Network.

The Kittitas County Health Network is excited to announce that starting April 1, 2024, the Hearts & Hands of Kittitas County will be transferring operations of the lending library including the lending of mobility equipment, distribution of incontinence supplies, and nutritional supplementation. The KCHN team will be actively working to make the transition as smooth and seamless as possible for the residents of Kittitas County. The Hospice volunteer program has been transferred to Kittitas Valley Healthcare. We would like to thank the Hearts & Hand of Kittitas County board and staff who have diligently worked to ensure hospice and other vital healthcare services to Kittitas County free of charge since 1983.

The Kittitas County Health Network is thrilled to be able to continue to operate this important service in Kittitas County as the goal of the KCHN since its creation in 2017, has always been to make Kittitas County a healthier place for all to call home.

Important transition details:

- The lending library service will continue to be operated at 302 E. 2nd Ave (corner of 2nd and Ruby) in Ellensburg from 9am-4pm, Monday through Friday, and at 116 N. Oakes Ave, #B in Cle Elum Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday from 9am-4pm. The offices can be reached at 509-968-5117 for Ellensburg and 509-955-3780 for Cle Elum.
- Donations of equipment and supplies will continue to be accepted at either location during open hours only. Thank you for ensuring that donations are in working order and clean.


Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) Training available!

How to be more trauma-informed


