Dear Saints who are FPC,

Years ago, I was the pastor of a church in Erie, Pennsylvania. The first winter I was there we have 94 inches of snow but the city was geared for it and roads were kept clear. It was a place of beauty that was completely different than the lush beauty of Florida.

One year we had a children's Christmas pageant brilliantly written by one of the elders. But, as always, it was a challenge to come up with enough parts for all the children. A boy of about 4 was given the role of the "carrier of straw for the stable." The pageant was about the journey to Bethlehem and the cast of characters moved all around the sanctuary as they acted out the journey taken by the holy family. In this pageant a whole cast of characters were never mentioned in the Bible. At first the straw carrier was having fun. But, as the pageant went on and on with lines he didn't understand, he got tired. At the next stop he made up a line for himself despite the intention that his role was to have no lines, "Are we there yet?" At every stop he asked, "Are we there yet?" and at the next stop, "Are we there yet?" This went on stop after stop way past the limits of his interest. Finally, they got to the stable. Again, his question, "Are we there yet?" Mary told them they were there now. He flung his straw upon the floor and exclaimed loudly, "Finally!!" and turned and walked out of the sanctuary. He had done what he was told. He made it to the stable, but he just couldn't see the point. Besides, the straw was scratchy and cookies were downstairs and his sister kept telling him to be quiet. Enough was enough. Exit the 'Straw Carrier!"

His actions implanted that story of the journey to Bethlehem firmly in my memory and still makes me wonder about who else was on the road and who was in the stable in Bethlehem and what they felt and learned. For me, it made the story human and memorable. It is still my favorite Christmas pageant.

Walk your way to Bethlehem carefully this year. Who knows where a brilliant 4-year-old might be lurking and waiting to make it real for you.


