For thanksgiving the food was as traditional as we could get it. I'm not sure what we put in place of turkeys because I don't remember them at all – probably a great supply of chickens. We had veggies of all sorts and cranberry sauce! For me the best thing was the pumpkin pie served with lots of real cream on top (i.e. not out of a spray can).

It was also a time to remember stories from America of our memories of American Thanksgivings – made much better by visiting grandparents and cousins and other extended family.

I remember my father's prayers that included gratitude for the survival of WWII and other conflicts and an awareness of events in the world from which we were spared by our gracious God.

I remember Thanksgiving hymns – "For the beauty of the earth;" and "God of our fathers".

I also remember that one of the joys of attending an international school was that we got invited into thanksgiving-type meals with the Canadians, the English, the Swiss, Indians and some 20 or so others countries.

Common to all was the giving of thanks to God for the abundant and over-flowing grace in which we lived.

May your thanksgiving this year be filled with an awareness of God's bountiful gifts and joy in sharing them with others.


Our newest members- The Thomas family
