Dear Saints,

There are great differences in the timing of our reliving and celebration of Jesus' life in how we see it year to year in the Lectionary. Some years we take 9 Sundays after Epiphany to get to the Transfiguration and the beginning of Lent.

This year the lectionary rushes us to Lent in 5 Sundays after Epiphany. We celebrate Jesus' words and skip from our being Salt/Light/the gift of the Law, to the Transfiguration (which we will celebrate this Sunday, February 15).

That means this year we pass over:

- not insulting our siblings, not committing adultery, not sinning, not divorcing, not swearing deceitfully but giving straightforward honest answers;
- overcoming evil with suffering, not refusing the one who begs from you, loving your enemies, praying for those who persecute you, going the second mile, be perfect as God is perfect;
- serve only one master, not worry, strive first for the kingdom of God and everything needful will be given to you; and
- doing the will of God in heaven, being wise and not foolish.

Now we pause to consider the report of Jesus talking with Moses and Elijah on a mountain with Peter, James and John as witnesses.

I confess I have too easily stepped into and out of the story of the Transfiguration. But, our reaction ought to be one of amazement. How are we to take this story? as fact? as legend? as too good not to be true? Come and think with us about this amazing story as we prepare for the season of Lent.

Shrove Tuesday in February

FPC's celebration of Shrove Tuesday sees us partnering again with St. Edmund's Episcopal Church in Pfrangle Hall. Last year nearly 100 people came to eat and enjoy fellowship. This year's date is **Tuesday, Feb. 17 from 5-7 p.m.**

Please plan to be a part of this all-you-can- eat dinner. It's pancakes, sausage, toast, orange juice, coffee, and water.

Tickets are **\$8** and can be purchased in the front office or from Jill. Tickets can also be bought at the door.

Mardi Gras, synonymous with Carnival celebrations in New Orleans, Venice and Rio, is marked in similarly festive fashion around the world.

However, what began as a holiday rooted in religious tradition has become a cultural phenomenon, leading to parties for the sake of partying, and not necessarily in anticipation of 40 days of penance between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday.

Along the way, **Shrove Tuesday** emerged as the last day of Shrovetide, the week preceding the start of Lent. The word **Shrovetide** is the English equivalent of Carnival, which comes from the Latin words *carnem levare*, meaning "to take away the flesh."

To prepare for Lent, Christians prepared pancakes to deplete their stock of eggs, milk, butter and fat, giving rise to Pancake Day in England. As the tradition spread through Europe, it became Mardi Gras in France, where waffles and crepes are prepared as part of a lavish feast.
