
Petitioning for a Peace Garden and Peace Pole in Dix Garden

FRIENDSHIPS AND CONNECTIONS, Part 2

In the last issue of our Friendship Force newsletter, you read an article written by Doyle Long that highlighted the friendships that members make while on FF journeys – something that we all look forward to doing in the not-too-distant future. By coincidence, we now have a follow up story to long-lasting friendships that are formed. I have removed names from the emails and edited slightly for clarity.

Recently, Mike Rakouskas received the following inquiry from a man named Tony in the UK:

My name is Tony from the UK and I was involved with the 2nd exchange ...a few years ago! The first one was Atlanta to Newcastle in 77. In 1977 I lived in Durham Co Durham in the UK. The reason for my email is as follows...

I was watching a documentary on Jimmy Carter a few weeks ago and it reminded me of his visit to the UK in 1977 and the Friendship Force exchange that followed. I took part in the trip to Raleigh and Durham and stayed with a couple and their daughters. They had a fabulous house in a very leafy affluent area of Raleigh I think ...but can't remember too much detail. Over the days we met some lovely people and experienced some great days. We met your Governer Jim Hunt at a garden party. Some of the group visited Atlanta, GA, to reconnect with friends from the 1st exchange. It was all wonderful.

Anyway after a few years you lose touch and grow old, but from time-to-time I look back fondly on those days.

So my questions are: Are you a long-standing member of the Friendship Force? Do you know anyone from the early formations of the group? I'd love to hear from anyone who may remember this family. I'm not part of Facebook or Instagram so rely on good old email. If you know anyone who may be able to connect, I'd be grateful if you'd be so kind to pass on my email. Thank you.

In turn, Mike passed this inquiry on to several members, including Pete and Judy Benda. Here's the response Pete wrote to Tony.

Tony, I have read the email forwarded to me by Mike and will be glad to provide what update I can along with a copy to the family to put you both back in touch. I was not part of the Newcastle exchange in 1978, but my wife Judy and I did enjoy spending time in Newcastle way back in 1968 when we were chaperones for a summer school program at Durham University. We moved to Raleigh in 1978 and got to know the couple you mention first through our church and then later when we became active in a new program called Citizens for International Understanding (CIU).

And with that, Pete provided a little additional information, including that the “very leafy affluent area of Raleigh” was North Ridge and a phone number as well as email. Tony in turn was very appreciative that he could now make direct contact with the people he remembered in Raleigh.
