Pete's Article to accompany this story:

Judy and I were interviewed at our Raleigh home for this video at the request of Lora Sinigur, International Liaison with the NC Secretary of State's office. We have enjoyed being home hosts for Moldovans on two occasions – in 2017 for four teachers and in 2019 for two librarians. We have found our guests to be bright, appreciative, enthusiastic, and lovely representatives of their country and would strongly recommend such an experience to any of the Raleigh Friendship Force members who may have time and a guest room in their home.

Interestingly we received a FaceTime call from Victoria Isaak, one of our 2017 Moldovan guests, shortly after the program aired. She had just watched it and wanted to thank us for the portion of the program we participated in. Victoria is one of the teachers of English for whom we have also

done Skype visits with her classroom of students in Moldova.



As an aid to the English teachers there (and as part of our downsizing to move from our home to the Springmoor Retirement Community), we recently shipped a full set of encyclopedia Britannica and a 52-year collection of National Geographic magazines, plus a dozen or more boxes of English language books to be used in Moldovan classrooms and libraries.

As Pete mentioned, in 2017 Friendship Force of Raleigh hosted teachers from Moldova as part of the Open World program. The teachers had partnerships with schools in NC, which they visited. They were also provided the opportunity to visit the state's textbook warehouse and select books for their classroom. This large quantity of books was shipped to Moldova and our club donated \$250 toward the shipment expense.





Friendship Force Mountain Weekend, June 3-5, 2022

From Olga:

There are no words to express my gratitude to the club for donating \$500 in my honor to "Revived Soldiers of Ukraine." This organization that has been doing so many incredible things for Ukraine and Ukrainians. Just to name a few – they bought ambulances for field hospitals and military medics to evacuate wounded soldiers and civilians from war zones to nearby hospitals.



They bought medical drones that are equipped with a



storage box that can adjust the temperature of cargo. These drones can deliver the necessary medicines to hot spots in Ukraine and occupied cities that are inaccessible.

Thank you, Friendship Force of Northern Colorado, whose \$50 donation to the Raleigh club was then donated to Ukrainians in the Carolinas. We were able to deliver 460 pounds of necessary medical supplies to Ukraine with the support from our local community. My friend and I traveled to Poland to meet volunteers there and then we took a train to Kyiv to visit Bucha and Irpin – cities that were hit the closest to the capital of Ukraine. I have just returned from this two week trip.
